13 14 15 16 17 18 19	(F) THE STATE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS AND PROTOCOLS FOR THE DISPATCH AND REIMBURSEMENT OF PRIVATE HELICOPTER COMPANIES TO SUPPORT THE MEDICALLY ORIENTED FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE, SPECIAL OPERATIONS BUREAU, AVIATION COMMAND. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
