A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Procurement – Service Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise Participation**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a certain participation goal for certain certified
4 service disabled veteran business enterprises for certain procurement contracts;
5 requiring a certain awarding unit to consider certain efforts by and award
6 certain contracts to certain bidders or offerors that meet or make a good-faith
7 effort to meet certain participation goals; establishing certain criteria by which
8 a contractor is considered to have made a good-faith effort to meet certain
9 participation goals; requiring the Maryland Department of Veterans Affairs and
10 the Department of Business and Economic Development jointly to adopt certain
11 regulations; requiring the Department of Veterans Affairs and the Department
12 of Business and Economic Development to designate an advocate to coordinate
13 and oversee certain activities relating to service disabled veteran business
14 enterprises; requiring an awarding unit to adopt certain regulations to meet the
15 requirements of this Act; requiring an awarding unit to designate a service
16 disabled veteran business enterprise advocate to assist the awarding unit in
17 meeting goals related to service disabled veteran business enterprise
18 participation; requiring certain awarding units to make certain reports on or
19 before a certain date; requiring the Department of Veterans Affairs and the
20 Department of Business and Economic Development to make certain reports on
21 or before certain dates; requiring the Department of Business and Economic
22 Development to adopt certain regulations regarding the decertification of
23 certain entities and to oversee and coordinate certain outreach programs and
24 activities; requiring the Department of Business and Economic Development to
25 use certain resources to implement a certain program; establishing certain
26 prohibited acts and certain penalties for certain violations; defining certain
27 terms; and generally relating to procurement participation by service disabled
28 veteran business enterprises.

17 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
18 INDICATED.

19 (B) “AWARDING UNIT” MEANS A UNIT OF STATE GOVERNMENT OR AN
20 OFFICIAL OF THE STATE THAT ENTERS INTO CONTRACTS ON BEHALF OF THE
21 STATE.

22 (C) “CERTIFICATION” MEANS THE DETERMINATION THAT A LEGAL
23 ENTITY IS A SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE FOR THE
24 PURPOSES OF THIS SUBTITLE.

25 (D) “CERTIFIED SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE”
26 MEANS A BUSINESS THAT IS CERTIFIED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT
27 OF VETERANS AFFAIRS AS A SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN–OWNED BUSINESS.

28 (E) “SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN” MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO:

29 (1) IS A VETERAN, AS DEFINED UNDER 38 U.S.C. § 101(2); AND

30 (2) HAS A DISABILITY THAT IS SERVICE–CONNECTED, AS DEFINED
31 UNDER 38 U.S.C. § 101(16).

1 (F) (1) **“SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE” HAS**
2 **THE MEANING STATED IN EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 13360 ISSUED ON OCTOBER**
3 **21, 2004, BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.**

4 (2) **TO THE EXTENT NOT INCONSISTENT WITH FEDERAL LAW,**
5 **“SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE” INCLUDES:**

6 (I) **A SOLE PROPRIETORSHIP OWNED BY SERVICE**
7 **DISABLED VETERANS;**

8 (II) **A SUBSIDIARY THAT IS WHOLLY OWNED BY A PARENT**
9 **CORPORATION IN WHICH THE MAJORITY OF EACH CLASS OF ISSUED AND**
10 **OUTSTANDING STOCK OF THE PARENT COMPANY IS OWNED BY ONE OR MORE**
11 **SERVICE DISABLED VETERANS;**

12 (III) **A JOINT VENTURE IN WHICH THE MAJORITY OF THE**
13 **JOINT VENTURE’S MANAGEMENT, CONTROL, AND PROFITS ARE OWNED BY ONE**
14 **OR MORE SERVICE DISABLED VETERANS;**

15 (IV) **A LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY IN WHICH MAJORITY**
16 **INTERESTS ARE OWNED BY ONE OR MORE SERVICE DISABLED VETERANS; AND**

17 (V) **A CORPORATION IN WHICH THE MAJORITY OF EACH**
18 **CLASS OF ISSUED AND OUTSTANDING STOCK IS OWNED BY ONE OR MORE**
19 **SERVICE DISABLED VETERANS.**

21 (A) **NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW CREATING**
22 **SOME OTHER PREFERENCE OR PROGRAM, AN AWARDED UNIT SHALL**
23 **ESTABLISH A PROCUREMENT PARTICIPATION GOAL OF 3% FOR CERTIFIED**
24 **SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES.**

25 (B) **ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2013, THE MARYLAND**

5 RESPONSIBLE OFFEROR TO MEET SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS
6 ENTERPRISE GOALS;

7 (2) AWARD THE CONTRACT TO THE LOWEST RESPONSIBLE
8 BIDDER OR RESPONSIBLE OFFEROR THAT MEETS OR MAKES A GOOD-FAITH
9 EFFORT TO MEET THE GOALS; AND

10 (3) AWARD THE CONTRACT TO A PRIME CONTRACTOR THAT IS
11 QUALIFIED UNDER § 14-601 OF THIS SUBTITLE AND THAT FULFILLS THE
12 PROCUREMENT PERCENTAGE REQUIREMENTS UNDER § 14-602 OF THIS
13 SUBTITLE.

14 (B) A BIDDER OR OFFEROR SHALL BE CONSIDERED TO HAVE MADE A
15 GOOD-FAITH EFFORT TO MEET THE GOALS SPECIFIED IN § 14-602 OF THIS
16 SUBTITLE IF THE BIDDER OR OFFEROR SUBMITS DOCUMENTARY EVIDENCE
17 THAT:

18 (1) THE BIDDER OR OFFEROR CONTACTED THE AWARDING UNIT
19 TO IDENTIFY CERTIFIED SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES;

20 (2) THE BIDDER OR OFFEROR CONTACTED THE UNITED STATES
21 DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS OR HAS SEARCHED THE UNITED STATES
22 DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS DATABASE AT [WWW.VIP.VETBIZ.GOV](http://www.vip.vetbiz.gov) TO
23 IDENTIFY CERTIFIED SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES;

24 (3) UNLESS TIME LIMITS IMPOSED BY THE AWARDING UNIT DID
25 NOT MAKE IT FEASIBLE, THE BIDDER OR OFFEROR PUBLISHED AN
26 ADVERTISEMENT IN FEDERAL BUSINESS OPPORTUNITIES (FBO);

27 (4) THE BIDDER OR OFFEROR PROVIDED NOTICE OF AN
28 INVITATION FOR BIDS OR A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS TO POTENTIAL SERVICE
29 DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE CONTRACTORS; AND

30 (5) THE BIDDER OR OFFEROR CONSIDERED AVAILABLE
31 CERTIFIED SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES FOR
32 CONTRACTING.

1 (A) THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
2 SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO:

3 (1) DECERTIFY SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS
4 ENTERPRISES THAT HAVE BEEN DECERTIFIED BY THE UNITED STATES
5 DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS OR AS A RESULT OF VIOLATIONS OF ANY
6 PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE;

7 (2) ESTABLISH A SYSTEM FOR TRACKING SERVICE DISABLED
8 VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES; AND

9 (3) ESTABLISH EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS TO ASSIST SERVICE
10 DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES IN BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AND
11 PARTICIPATION IN STATE PROCUREMENT ACTIVITIES.

12 (B) THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
13 SHALL DESIGNATE AN ADVOCATE TO:

14 (1) COORDINATE WITH THE MARYLAND DEPARTMENT OF
15 VETERANS AFFAIRS TO CONDUCT OUTREACH AND EDUCATION FOR EXISTING
16 AND POTENTIAL DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES;

17 (2) OVERSEE, PROMOTE, AND COORDINATE EFFORTS TO
18 FACILITATE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SUBTITLE;

19 (3) DISSEMINATE INFORMATION RELATING TO THIS SUBTITLE;

20 (4) COORDINATE REPORTS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE;

21 (5) COORDINATE WITH AWARDING UNITS AND EXISTING AND
22 POTENTIAL SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES TO ACHIEVE
23 THE GOALS OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND

24 (6) COORDINATE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF EDUCATIONAL
25 PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE.

27 (A) AN AWARDING UNIT SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO:

28 (1) CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND

29 (2) MONITOR ADHERENCE TO THE GOALS SPECIFIED IN THIS
30 SUBTITLE.

1 **(B) AN AWARDING UNIT SHALL DESIGNATE A SERVICE DISABLED**
2 **VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE ADVOCATE TO:**

3 **(1) ASSIST CERTIFIED SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS**
4 **ENTERPRISES IN PARTICIPATING IN THE AWARDING UNIT'S PROCUREMENT**
5 **ACTIVITIES;**

6 **(2) ASSIST PROCUREMENT OFFICERS IN SEEKING CERTIFIED**
7 **SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES TO PARTICIPATE IN THE**
8 **AWARDING UNIT'S PROCUREMENT ACTIVITIES;**

9 **(3) SERVE AS AN ADVOCATE FOR CERTIFIED SERVICE DISABLED**
10 **VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES THAT PARTICIPATE IN THE AWARDING UNIT'S**
11 **PROCUREMENT ACTIVITIES;**

12 **(4) REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC**
13 **DEVELOPMENT REGARDING A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND**

14 **(5) COORDINATE WITH THE SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN**
15 **BUSINESS ENTERPRISE ADVOCATE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND**
16 **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TO MEET THE GOALS OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

18 **(A) WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE END OF EACH FISCAL YEAR, AN**
19 **AWARDING UNIT SHALL REPORT, FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR, THE**
20 **FOLLOWING INFORMATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS AND**
21 **THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT:**

22 **(1) THE TOTAL NUMBER AND VALUE OF PROCUREMENT**
23 **CONTRACTS BETWEEN THE AWARDING UNIT AND CERTIFIED SERVICE DISABLED**
24 **VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISES;**

25 **(2) THE PERCENTAGE THAT THE CONTRACTS UNDER ITEM (1) OF**
26 **THIS SUBSECTION REPRESENT OF THE TOTAL NUMBER AND VALUE OF THE**
27 **AWARDING UNIT'S PROCUREMENT CONTRACTS FUNDED BY FEDERAL DOLLARS;**

28 **(3) IF THE AWARDING UNIT DID NOT MEET THE GOALS**
29 **ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR:**

30 **(I) THE REASONS THE AWARDING UNIT DID NOT MEET THE**
31 **GOALS; AND**

32 **(II) STEPS THE AWARDING UNIT WILL TAKE DURING THE**
33 **NEXT FISCAL YEAR IN AN EFFORT TO MEET THE GOALS; AND**

1 (4) OTHER INFORMATION AS REQUIRED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF
2 VETERANS AFFAIRS OR THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF BUSINESS ADVOCACY

12 (A) A PERSON MAY NOT:

13 (1) KNOWINGLY AND WITH INTENT TO DEFRAUD, FRAUDULENTLY
14 OBTAIN, RETAIN, ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN OR RETAIN, OR AID ANOTHER IN
15 FRAUDULENTLY OBTAINING OR RETAINING OR ATTEMPTING TO OBTAIN OR
16 RETAIN, CERTIFICATION AS A SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS
17 ENTERPRISE FOR THE PURPOSE OF PARTICIPATING IN STATE PROCUREMENT
18 ACTIVITIES UNDER THIS SUBTITLE;

19 (2) WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY MAKE A FALSE STATEMENT
20 WITH THE INTENT TO DEFRAUD, WHETHER BY AFFIDAVIT, REPORT, OR OTHER
21 REPRESENTATION, TO A STATE OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE FOR THE PURPOSE OF
22 INFLUENCING THE CERTIFICATION OR DENIAL OF CERTIFICATION OF ANY
23 ENTITY AS A SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE;

24 (3) WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY OBSTRUCT, IMPEDE, OR
25 ATTEMPT TO OBSTRUCT OR IMPEDE, A STATE OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE WHO IS
26 INVESTIGATING THE QUALIFICATIONS OF A BUSINESS ENTITY THAT HAS
27 REQUESTED CERTIFICATION AS A SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS
28 ENTERPRISE;

29 (4) KNOWINGLY AND WITH INTENT TO DEFRAUD, FRAUDULENTLY
30 OBTAIN, ATTEMPT TO OBTAIN, OR AID ANOTHER PERSON IN FRAUDULENTLY
31 OBTAINING OR ATTEMPTING TO OBTAIN, PUBLIC MONEY, PROCUREMENT
32 CONTRACTS, OR FUNDS EXPENDED UNDER A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT TO
33 WHICH THE PERSON IS NOT ENTITLED UNDER THIS ARTICLE;

34 (5) KNOWINGLY AND WITH INTENT TO DEFRAUD, FRAUDULENTLY
35 REPRESENT PARTICIPATION OF A SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN BUSINESS

1 ENTERPRISE IN ORDER TO OBTAIN OR RETAIN A BID PREFERENCE OR A
2 PROCUREMENT CONTRACT;

3 (6) WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY MAKE OR SUBSCRIBE TO ANY
4 STATEMENT, DECLARATION, OR OTHER DOCUMENT THAT IS FRAUDULENT OR
5 FALSE AS TO ANY MATERIAL MATTER, WHETHER OR NOT THAT FALSITY OR
6 FRAUD IS COMMITTED WITH THE KNOWLEDGE OR CONSENT OF THE PERSON
7 AUTHORIZED OR REQUIRED TO PRESENT THE DECLARATION, STATEMENT, OR
8 DOCUMENT;

9 (7) WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY AID, ASSIST IN, PROCURE,
10 COUNSEL, OR ADVISE THE PREPARATION OR PRESENTATION OF A
11 DECLARATION, STATEMENT, OR OTHER DOCUMENT THAT IS FRAUDULENT OR
12 FALSE AS TO ANY MATERIAL MATTER, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THAT FALSITY
13 OR FRAUD IS COMMITTED WITH THE KNOWLEDGE OR CONSENT OF THE PERSON
14 AUTHORIZED OR REQUIRED TO PRESENT THE DECLARATION, STATEMENT, OR
15 DOCUMENT;

16 (8) WILLFULLY AND KNOWINGLY FAIL TO FILE ANY DECLARATION
17 OR NOTICE WITH THE AWARDING UNIT THAT IS REQUIRED BY THIS SUBTITLE;
18 OR

19 (9) ESTABLISH, KNOWINGLY AID IN THE ESTABLISHMENT OF, OR
20 EXERCISE CONTROL OVER A BUSINESS FOUND TO HAVE VIOLATED A PROVISION
21 OF ITEMS (1) THROUGH (8) OF THIS SUBSECTION.

22 (B) (1) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF
23 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND
24 ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 OR
25 IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 6 MONTHS OR BOTH.

26 (2) IN ADDITION TO THE PENALTIES UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF
27 THIS SUBSECTION, A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF
28 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE:

29 (I) FOR THE FIRST OFFENSE, LIABLE FOR A CIVIL PENALTY
30 OF NOT LESS THAN \$10,000 AND NOT EXCEEDING \$30,000; AND

31 (II) FOR A SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, LIABLE FOR A CIVIL
32 PENALTY OF NOT LESS THAN \$30,000 AND NOT EXCEEDING \$50,000.

33 (3) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF
34 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL PAY ALL COSTS AND ATTORNEY'S FEES
35 INCURRED BY THE PLAINTIFF IN A CIVIL ACTION BROUGHT UNDER THIS
36 SUBTITLE.

1 **(C) (1) IN ACCORDANCE WITH TITLE 16 OF THIS ARTICLE, A PERSON**
2 **WHO IS CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION**
3 **SHALL:**

4 **(I) FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, BE DEBARRED FOR A PERIOD OF**
5 **NOT LESS THAN 3 YEARS AND, IF CERTIFIED AS A SERVICE DISABLED VETERAN**
6 **BUSINESS ENTERPRISE, BE STRIPPED OF THE CERTIFICATION FOR A PERIOD OF**
7 **NOT LESS THAN 3 YEARS; AND**

8 **(II) FOR A SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, BE DEBARRED FOR A**
9 **PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN 5 YEARS AND, IF CERTIFIED AS A SERVICE DISABLED**
10 **VETERAN BUSINESS ENTERPRISE, BE STRIPPED OF THE CERTIFICATION FOR A**
11 **PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN 5 YEARS.**

12 **(2) A DEBARMENT OR REVOCATION OF CERTIFICATION UNDER**
13 **THIS SUBSECTION SHALL APPLY TO THE PRINCIPALS OF THE BUSINESS AND ANY**
14 **SUBSEQUENT BUSINESSES FORMED OR FINANCED BY, OR AFFILIATED WITH,**
15 **THOSE PRINCIPALS.**

16 **(3) THE BOARD SHALL PROHIBIT A BUSINESS OR PERSON WHO**
17 **FAILS TO SATISFY THE PENALTIES, COSTS, AND ATTORNEY'S FEES IMPOSED**
18 **UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION FROM FURTHER CONTRACTING WITH**
19 **THE STATE UNTIL THE PENALTIES ARE SATISFIED.**

20 **(D) (1) THE AWARDING UNIT SHALL REPORT ALL ALLEGED**
21 **VIOLATIONS OF THIS SECTION TO THE BOARD.**

22 **(2) THE BOARD SUBSEQUENTLY SHALL REPORT ALL ALLEGED**
23 **VIOLATIONS OF THIS SECTION TO THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL,**
24 **WHICH SHALL DETERMINE WHETHER TO BRING A CIVIL ACTION AGAINST A**
25 **PERSON OR BUSINESS FOR A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION.**

27 (a) A person may be debarred from entering into a contract with the State if
28 the person, an officer, partner, controlling stockholder or principal of that person, or
29 any other person substantially involved in that person's contracting activities has:

30 (1) been convicted under the laws of the State, another state or the
31 United States of:

32 (i) a criminal offense incident to obtaining, attempting to
33 obtain, or performing a public or private contract, except as provided in § 16-202; or

1 (ii) fraud, embezzlement, theft, forgery, falsification or
2 destruction of records, or receiving stolen property;

3 (2) been convicted of a criminal violation of an antitrust statute of the
4 State, another state, or the United States;

5 (3) been convicted of a violation of the Racketeer Influenced and
6 Corrupt Organization Act, or the Mail Fraud Act, for acts in connection with the
7 submission of bids or proposals for a public or private contract;

8 (4) been convicted of a violation of § 14-308 of this article;

9 (5) been convicted of conspiracy to commit any act or omission that
10 would constitute grounds for conviction under any of the laws or statutes described in
11 paragraphs (1), (2), (3), or (4) of this subsection;

12 (6) been found civilly liable under an antitrust statute of the State,
13 another state, or the United States for acts or omissions in connection with the
14 submission of bids or proposals for a public or private contract; [or]

15 (7) been found in a final adjudicated decision to have violated the
16 Commercial Nondiscrimination Policy under Title 19 of this article with regard to a
17 public or private contract; **OR**

18 (8) **BEEN CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF § 14-607(A) OF THIS**
19 **ARTICLE.**

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Department of
21 Business and Economic Development shall use existing resources to implement the
22 Service Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise Participation goals established under
23 Title 14, Subtitle 6 of the State Finance and Procurement Article, as enacted by
24 Section 1 of this Act.

25 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
26 October 1, 2009.
