AN ACT concerning

A BILL ENTITLED

Public Health - Construction Sites - Toilets and Lavatories

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a State or local authority from issuing a certain building permit for certain construction projects unless the site has a toilet and lavatory that meet certain requirements; requiring certain toilets to be flush toilets under certain circumstances; providing that certain provisions apply only to certain construction projects that have a certain total cost; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the provision of toilets and lavatories at construction sites.
