

# SENATE BILL 762

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## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation – Workforce Development**  
3 **and Adult Learning – Administration**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Institutional Educator Pay Plan  
5 Advisory Committee; providing that the State Board of Education is the sole  
6 State agency responsible for administering a certain federal act; altering the  
7 name of a certain division within the Department of Labor, Licensing, and  
8 Regulation; altering the duties of the division; providing that certain personnel  
9 who transfer from a certain school system or certain library system to the  
10 Department shall be given certain service credit; repealing the authority of the  
11 State Board to waive certain residence and withdrawal requirements for a  
12 certain examination under certain circumstances; authorizing the Secretary of  
13 Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to waive certain residence and withdrawal  
14 requirements for a certain examination under certain circumstances; requiring  
15 the Department to offer certain examinations a certain number of times per  
16 year rather than requiring certain individuals to take a certain examination a  
17 certain number of times per year; altering the membership of the Education and  
18 Workforce Training Coordinating Council for correctional institutions; requiring  
19 a certain council to meet a certain number of times per year; repealing the  
20 requirement for the Secretary to appoint a certain director; requiring the  
21 Secretary to appoint a certain director; clarifying the title and duties of a  
22 certain director; authorizing the use of certain funds for certain programs at a  
23 certain correctional institution; providing that certain employees have satisfied  
24 certain requirements under certain circumstances; altering a certain defined  
25 term; and generally relating to the administration of workforce development  
26 and adult learning services in the Department of Labor, Licensing, and  
27 Regulation.

24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

26 **Article – Education**

27 6–303.

28 (a) There is an Institutional Educator Pay Plan Advisory Committee.

29 (b) (1) The Advisory Committee shall consist of:

30 (i) [Four] **FIVE** employee educators whose positions are  
31 included in the Institutional Educator Pay Plan established under § 6–302 of this  
32 subtitle from each of the following units:

33 1. The Division of [Correctional Education]  
34 **WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT AND ADULT LEARNING** in the Department of  
35 [Education] **LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION**;



1 (1) Cooperate with the appropriate federal agencies in administering  
2 the federal acts;

3 (2) Do anything necessary to secure the benefits of the federal acts;

4 (3) Facilitate the transfer of federal funds to the appropriate  
5 operational entity **INCLUDING THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND**  
6 **REGULATION;** and

7 (4) Represent this State in all matters relating to the administration  
8 of the federal acts.

9 (D) **THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL BE THE SOLE STATE**  
10 **AGENCY RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE CARL D. PERKINS**  
11 **CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION ACT.**

12 **Article – Labor and Employment**

13 11–102.

14 (a) There is a Division of Workforce Development **AND ADULT LEARNING**  
15 within the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation.

16 (b) The Division has the powers, duties, responsibilities, and functions  
17 provided in the laws of this State.

18 (c) The Division has the general purpose of advancing the economic welfare  
19 of the people by coordinating the State’s public and private resources for **ADULT**  
20 **LEARNING,** employment, and job training.

21 11–103.

22 (a) The Division shall:

23 (1) promote apprenticeship and training programs;

24 (2) administer job training, placement, and service programs;

25 (3) implement the provisions of the Workforce Investment Act;

26 (4) **ADMINISTER ADULT EDUCATION AND LITERACY SERVICES**  
27 **PROGRAMS;**

28 (5) **CONDUCT EDUCATIONAL AND JOB SKILLS TRAINING**  
29 **PROGRAMS IN ADULT CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES;**

1            [(4) (6)        oversee any other units established pursuant to State or  
2 federal employment, training, or manpower statutes; and

3            [(5) (7)        administer those programs assigned to the Division by law  
4 or designated by the Secretary.

5            (b)        The Division shall meet and confer on a regular basis with  
6 representatives of the State's community colleges, appointed by the Maryland  
7 Association of Community Colleges, **AND THE ADULT EDUCATION COMMUNITY,**  
8 **APPOINTED BY THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION FOR ADULT CONTINUING AND**  
9 **COMMUNITY EDUCATION,** to assure that **ADULT EDUCATION AND LITERACY**  
10 **SERVICES AND** job training activities and resources are effectively coordinated.

12            **FOR THE PURPOSE OF ESTABLISHING COMPENSATION RATES AND BASIC**  
13 **RATES FOR VACATION AND SICK LEAVE CREDIT EARNINGS, PROFESSIONAL**  
14 **PERSONNEL WHO WERE EMPLOYED BY A COUNTY SCHOOL SYSTEM OR THE**  
15 **PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEM IN THE STATE AND WHO ARE SUBSEQUENTLY**  
16 **APPOINTED TO POSITIONS IN THE DEPARTMENT TO PROVIDE SERVICES IN**  
17 **ACCORDANCE WITH SUBTITLES 8 AND 9 OF THIS TITLE SHALL BE GIVEN CREDIT**  
18 **AS EMPLOYEES OF THE DEPARTMENT FOR THEIR YEARS OF SERVICE AS**  
19 **EMPLOYEES OF THE COUNTY SCHOOL SYSTEM OR THE PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEM**  
20 **FROM WHICH THEY TRANSFERRED.**

21        11-801.

22            (a)        There is an Adult Education and Literacy Services Office in the Division  
23 of Workforce Development **AND ADULT LEARNING** of the Department.

24            (b)        The Adult Education and Literacy Services Office shall be the sole agency  
25 in the State responsible for administering and supervising policy and funding for adult  
26 education and literacy.

27        11-808.

28            (a)        An individual may obtain a high school diploma by examination as  
29 provided in this section if the individual:

30            (1)        has not obtained a high school diploma;

31            (2)        has resided in this State or on a federal reservation in this State  
32 for at least 3 months, provided that the [State Board of Education] **SECRETARY** may  
33 waive the residence requirement if the [State Board] **SECRETARY** considers the  
34 waiver justified;

1 (3) is 16 years old or older; and

2 (4) has withdrawn from a regular full-time public or private school  
3 program for at least 3 months, provided that the [State Board of Education]  
4 **SECRETARY** may waive the withdrawal requirement if the [State Board]  
5 **SECRETARY** considers the waiver justified.

6 (b) The Department shall [require] **OFFER EXAMINATIONS TO** individuals  
7 who are pursuing a high school diploma under this subtitle [to take an examination]  
8 at least twice each year at places throughout the State that are reasonably convenient  
9 for the applicants.

10 11-901.

11 (a) There is an Education and Workforce Training Coordinating Council for  
12 Correctional Institutions under the jurisdiction of the Department of Public Safety and  
13 Correctional Services and the Department.

14 (b) (1) The Council consists of [seven] **14** members.

15 (2) [One] **FOUR** of the members of the Council shall be [a resident]  
16 **RESIDENTS** of this State appointed by the Governor for a term of 4 years who **EACH**  
17 shall serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies **AS FOLLOWS:**

18 (I) **TWO REPRESENTING THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY;**

19 (II) **A FORMER OFFENDER; AND**

20 (III) **ONE MEMBER OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC.**

21 (3) The following officials shall serve ex officio:

22 (i) the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services;

23 (ii) the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation;

24 (iii) the State Superintendent of Schools;

25 (iv) the Secretary of Higher Education;

26 (V) **THE SECRETARY OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC**  
27 **DEVELOPMENT;**

28 (VI) **THE PRESIDENT OF A COMMUNITY COLLEGE IN THE**  
29 **STATE;**

1 (VII) THE CHAIR OF THE GOVERNOR'S WORKFORCE  
2 INVESTMENT BOARD;

3 (VIII) THE DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE  
4 SKILLS TRAINING FOR CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS;

5 [(v)] (IX) an official from a local correctional facility; and

6 [(vi)] (X) the county superintendent of schools from a county  
7 where a correctional institution of the Division of Correction is located, who shall be  
8 selected by the State Superintendent.

9 (d) (1) The Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services and the  
10 Secretary shall serve as cochairs of the Council.

11 (2) The Council:

12 (I) SHALL MEET AT LEAST FOUR TIMES PER YEAR;

13 (II) shall designate the time and place of its meetings; and

14 (III) may adopt rules for the conduct of its meetings.

15 (3) The Council shall be within the Department for administrative and  
16 budgetary purposes.

17 (4) The Department shall provide technical and clerical assistance and  
18 support to the Council.

19 11-903.

20 (a) The Department is responsible for the provision of education and  
21 workforce skills training programs in the adult correctional institutions in the State.

22 (b) The Secretary shall appoint a [Director of educational programs and a  
23 Director of workforce skills training for correctional institutions] **DIRECTOR OF**  
24 **EDUCATION AND WORKFORCE SKILLS TRAINING FOR CORRECTIONAL**  
25 **INSTITUTIONS.**

26 (c) [Each] **THE** Director shall receive the salary provided in the budget of  
27 the Department.

28 (d) The [Directors] **DIRECTOR** shall:

29 (1) implement and operate the educational and workforce skills  
30 training programs developed by the Council in the correctional institutions;

1           (2)    meet with and advise the Council about the programs; and

2           (3)    consult with the Commissioner of Correction and the warden of  
3 each institution about the operation of the programs.

4 11-906.

5           (a)    Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Patuxent Institution is a  
6 correctional institution within the Division of Correction and under the jurisdiction of  
7 the Education and Workforce Training and Coordinating Council for correctional  
8 institutions for the funding of educational **AND WORKFORCE SKILLS TRAINING**  
9 programs only.

10           SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That all employees in the  
11 Adult Education and Literacy Branch and the Correctional Education Program of the  
12 State Department of Education who are transferred to the Department of Labor,  
13 Licensing, and Regulation have satisfied the minimum qualification requirements of  
14 their classification in the State personnel management system and shall be  
15 transferred into the system without any further selection process.

16           SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
17 July 1, 2009.
