CHAPTER ____

1 AN ACT concerning

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Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation – Workforce Development and Adult Learning – Administration

FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Institutional Educator Pay Plan Advisory Committee; providing that the State Board of Education is the sole State agency responsible for administering a certain federal act; altering the name of a certain division within the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation; altering the duties of the division; providing that certain personnel who transfer from a certain school system or certain library system to the Department shall be given certain service credit; repealing the authority of the State Board to waive certain residence and withdrawal requirements for a certain examination under certain circumstances; authorizing the Secretary of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to waive certain residence and withdrawal requirements for a certain examination under certain circumstances; requiring the Department to offer certain examinations a certain number of times per year rather than requiring certain individuals to take a certain examination a certain number of times per year; altering the membership of the Education and Workforce Training Coordinating Council for correctional institutions; requiring a certain council to meet a certain number of times per year; repealing the requirement for the Secretary to appoint a certain director; requiring the Secretary to appoint a certain director; clarifying the title and duties of a certain director; authorizing the use of certain funds for certain programs at a certain correctional institution; providing that certain employees have satisfied certain requirements under certain circumstances; altering a certain defined term; and generally relating to the administration of workforce development
