17	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Governor shall
18	appoint one chiropractor member and three massage therapist members to the State
19	Board of Chiropractic and Massage Therapy Examiners in accordance with § 3–202 of
20	the Health Occupations Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act. The terms of the
21	members are as follows:
22	(1) the one chiropractor member and one massage therapist member
23	shall serve for a term of 2 years AND 2 MONTHS which shall begin on [July 1, 2009]

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30 21	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
31	measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,
32	has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
33	elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from
34	the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective through July 1, 2009, and, at the end of
35	July 1, 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall
36	be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
