BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Family Law Section 4-506(h) 4-506(b) and (h) Annotated Code of Maryland (2006 Replacement Volume and 2008 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Family Law** 4-506. (b) The temporary protective order shall state the date and time (1)(i) of the final protective order hearing. Unless continued for good cause, the final protective order hearing shall be held no later than 7 days after the temporary protective order is served on the respondent.
