CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

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Public Safety - Electronic Control Devices - Requirements

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from possessing or using a certain electronic 4 control device unless the person meets certain requirements; prohibiting a 5 certain electronic control device from being sold, possessed, or used in the State 6 unless the electronic control device meets certain requirements; requiring a 7 certain manufacturer to provide a certain law enforcement agency with prompt 8 access to certain records; establishing penalties for a violation of this Act; 9 providing for the construction of this Act; requiring the Police Training 10 Commission to require that certain curriculum and minimum courses of study include certain training for certain officers; requiring the Correctional Training 11 Commission to require that certain curriculum include certain training for 12 13 certain officers and to establish certain standards; requiring the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention to submit a certain report to certain 14 15 committees on or before a certain date; defining a certain term; providing for the 16 application of this Act; and generally relating to electronic control devices.
