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## Commission to Study the Impact of Large Truck Traffic on the Chesapeake Bay Bridge

## Chesapeake Bay Bridge - Required Study

- 5 FOR the purpose of establishing a Commission to Study the Impact of Large Truck 6 Traffic on the Chesapeake Bay Bridge; providing for the membership and staffing of the Commission; requiring the Governor to designate the chair of the 7 8 Commission; prohibiting members of the Commission from receiving certain 9 compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses: 10 requiring the Commission to study certain matters and to report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or before a 11 certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to 12 13 the Commission to Study the Impact of Large Truck Traffic on requiring the Maryland Transportation Authority, in consultation with certain groups, to 14 15 conduct a certain study; requiring the Authority to report on its findings to the 16 Governor and the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to a study regarding the Chesapeake Bay Bridge. 17
- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That:
- 20 (a) There is a Commission to Study the Impact of Large Truck Traffic on the 21 Chesapeake Bay Bridge.

9 10 11	(a) The Maryland Transportation Authority, in consultation with the Maryland Motor Truck Association and the Bay Bridge Reconstruction Advisory Group, shall conduct a study that includes the following:
12 13	(1) <u>a historical review of the utilization of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge</u> by vehicles of various classes;
14 15	(2) <u>a historical review of accident data on the Chesapeake Bay Bridge</u> by class of vehicle;
16 17	(3) a review of utilization of the Chesapeake Bay Bridge by large vehicles at various times of the day and days of the week;
18 19 20	(4) <u>a comparison of the volume of large truck traffic on bridges similar to the Chesapeake Bay Bridge in other parts of the country at various times of the day and days of the week; and</u>
21 22 23	(5) the impact that variable toll pricing for large vehicles has had on existing toll facilities nationally and on the volume of large vehicle traffic at various times of the day.
24 25 26	(g) (b) On or before January 1, 2010, the Commission Authority shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly.
27 28 29 30	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2009. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
