FOR the purpose of requiring each unit of the State to submit a certain report regarding the Minority Business Enterprise Program to the Joint Committee on Fair Practices within a certain number of days after the end of the fiscal year; and generally relating to the Minority Business Enterprise Program.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – State Finance and Procurement

16 14–305.

(a) (1) Within 90 days after the end of the fiscal year, each unit shall
report to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs [and], the certification agency, AND,

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SUBJECT TO § 2–1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON FAIR PRACTICES.

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(2) A report under this subsection shall for the preceding fiscal year:

4 (i) state the total number and value of procurement contracts 5 between the unit and certified minority business enterprises, by specific category of 6 minority business enterprise;

(ii) indicate the percentage that those procurement contracts
represent, by specific category of minority business enterprise, of the total number and
value of procurement contracts; and

10 (iii) contain other such information as required by the 11 Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and the certification agency and approved by the 12 Board.

(3) A report under this subsection shall be in a form prescribed by the
 Governor's Office of Minority Affairs and the certification agency and approved by the
 Board.

16 (b) (1) On or before December 31 of each year, the Governor's Office of 17 Minority Affairs shall submit to the Board of Public Works and, subject to § 2–1246 of 18 the State Government Article, to the Legislative Policy Committee a report 19 summarizing the information the Office receives under subsection (a) of this section.

20 (2) This report may be prepared in conjunction with the annual report 21 required under § 9–306 of the State Government Article.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectOctober 1, 2009.
