1 (a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the 2 requirements of this section.

- 3 (b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.
- 4 (c) The applicant shall be at least 18 years old.

5 (d) The applicant shall have a doctoral degree in psychology AS DEFINED IN
6 § 18–101(C) OF THIS TITLE.

7 (e) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, the applicant shall pass an 8 examination given by the Board under this subtitle.

9 (f) The applicant shall have at least 2 years of professional supervised 10 experience in psychology that is approved by the Board IN ACCORDANCE WITH 11 **REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD**. [At least 1 year of this required 12 experience shall have occurred after the doctoral degree is awarded.]

13 (g) (1) Except as provided in this subsection, an applicant shall reside or
 14 practice, or intend to reside or practice, in this State.

15 (2) The Board may issue a license to an applicant who is neither a 16 resident of this State nor practicing in this State if the applicant shows that issuing 17 the license would be in the interest of the citizens or government of this State.
