CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Injured Workers' Insurance Fund - Regulation and Status

FOR the purpose of requiring the Injured Workers' Insurance Fund to be operate in a manner similar to an authorized domestic workers' compensation insurer under certain provisions of the Insurance Article; requiring the Maryland Insurance Commissioner to issue and renew certain certificates of authority to the Fund in accordance with certain provisions of law; providing that the Fund is subject to certain provisions of law to the same extent as certain insurers and must be regulated in a certain manner; providing that certain provisions of law control in the event of a certain conflict; requiring the Fund to operate as an authorized domestic insurer; specifying the role and mission of the Fund; altering the requirement that the Fund keep certain reserves and surplus; specifying that members of the Board for the Fund are entitled to reimbursement for certain reasonable expenses; altering the frequency for payment of Board members; altering the manner in which the Board may carry out certain provisions of law; repealing certain obsolete provisions of law; requiring the Maryland Insurance Commissioner, as part of a certain examination, to determine whether certain rate making practices produce actuarially sound rates; altering the requirement that the Board for the Fund adopt a certain schedule of premium rates in a certain manner; making certain conforming changes; providing that certain provisions of law do not apply to certain employees of the Fund hired on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the regulation and status of the Injured Workers' Insurance Fund.
