## A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

## Talbot County - Alcoholic Beverages - Winery License

FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners of Talbot County to issue a Class W winery license to certain holders of a Class 4 manufacturer's license; specifying the privileges conferred by the Class $W$ winery license, including the ability to sell wine and other products for consumption on or off the premises and to maintain furnishings to enable patrons to consume wine and food; specifying that a Class W winery license is a 7 -day license exempt from certain quotas; providing a license fee; specifying the hours of sale for a Class W winery license; making a certain stylistic change; providing that a holder of a certain license may exchange that license for a Class W winery license under certain circumstances; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Talbot County.

BY adding to
Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages
Section $4-301$ to be under the new subtitle "Subtitle 3. Class W Winery Licenses"; and 11-521
Annotated Code of Maryland
(2005 Replacement Volume and 2008 Supplement)
SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages
SUBTITLE 3. Class W Winery Licenses.

## 4-301.

(A) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY IN TALBOT COUNTY.

## EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.
(B) The Board of License Commissioners of Talbot County may issue a Class W winery license to a licensee who:
(1) Holds a Class 4 manufacturer's License; and
(2) Has been a resident of the State for at least 2 years immediately before the filing of an application for the Class W WINERY LICENSE.
(C) The annual license fee shall be set by the Board but may NOT EXCEED $\$ 200$.
(D) A Class W WINERY LICENSE AUTHORIZES THE HOLDER TO:
(1) Provide samples of wine and other products PRODUCED BY THE LICENSEE AT NO CHARGE;
(2) SELL WINE AND OTHER PRODUCTS PRODUCED BY THE LICENSEE FOR CONSUMPTION ON OR OFF THE PREMISES;
(3) Hold Public and private events on the premises IDENTIFIED IN THE LICENSE;
(4) SELL AND SERVE FOOD INCIDENTAL TO THE SAMPLING OF WINE; AND
(5) MAINTAIN TABLES, CHAIRS, AND OTHER APPROPRIATE INDOOR AND OUTDOOR FURNISHINGS TO ENABLE PATRONS TO CONSUME WINE AND FOOD.
(E) A Class W Winery license is a 7-day license.
(F) A Class W winery license is exempt from any quota ESTABLISHED AS TO THE NUMBER OF LICENSES IN THE ELECTION DISTRICT where the Class $W$ winery license is to be located.
(G) A holder of a Class W winery license may locate the OPERATION:
(1) ON THE PREMISES FOR WHICH THE Class 4 MANUFACTURER'S LICENSE WAS ISSUED;
(2) AT THE SAME ADDRESS AS ANOTHER CLASS W WINERY LICENSE; OR
(3) AT ANOTHER LOCATION THAT THE BOARD APPROVES.

IN TALBOT COUNTY, FOR THE HOLDERS OF A CLASS W WINERY LICENSE, SALES ARE ALLOWED:
(1) MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY FROM 10 A.M. THROUGH 1:45 A.M. THE FOLLOWING DAY; AND
(2) SUNDAY FROM 10 A.M. THROUGH MIDNIGHT, EXCEPT IF Christmas Eve or New Year's Eve is on a Sunday, from 10 A.M. TO 2 A.M. THE FOLLOWING DAY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That a holder of a Class 4 license who holds a Class A light wine license issued by the Board of License Commissioners of Talbot County may surrender the Class A license to the Board and, in exchange, be issued a Class W winery license created by this Act at no charge. The expiration date of a Class W winery license issued under this section shall be the same as the expiration date of the surrendered Class A light wine license.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
