- 24 (A) THERE IS A FAMILY MEDICINE RURAL HEALTH COMMISSION.

- 1 **(B)** THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS: 2**(1)** A MEMBER OF THE SENATE, APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT 3 OF THE SENATE: 4 A MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY **(2)** 5 THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE; 6 **(3)** THE SECRETARY OF HIGHER EDUCATION, OR THE 7 SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE; 8 THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS, OR THE **(4)** 9 SUPERINTENDENT'S DESIGNEE; 10 THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE UNIVERSITY OF 11 MARYLAND MEDICAL SYSTEM; AND 12 **(6)** THE FOLLOWING EIGHT MEMBERS, APPOINTED BY THE 13 **GOVERNOR:** 14 (I)A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE REGIONAL HEALTHCARE 15 COMMITTEE OF THE TRI-COUNTY COUNCIL: 16 (II)A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND AREA HEALTH 17 **EDUCATION CENTERS**; 18 (III) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND STATE OFFICE 19 OF RURAL HEALTH: 20 (IV) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND ASSOCIATION 21**OF COUNTY HEALTH OFFICERS;** 22 **(V)** A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND RURAL 23**HEALTH ASSOCIATION:** 24(VI) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND HOSPITAL 25ASSOCIATION: 26 (VII) A LICENSED PHYSICIAN WHO PRACTICES MEDICINE IN 27A RURAL PART OF THE STATE; AND

- 1 (C) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR IS 3 YEARS.
- 3 (2) THE TERMS OF MEMBERS ARE STAGGERED AS REQUIRED BY
- 4 THE TERMS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION ON OCTOBER 1,
- 5 **2009.**
- 6 (3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve 7 Until a successor is appointed and qualifies.
- 8 (4) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN
- 9 SHALL SERVE FOR THE REST OF THE TERM OR UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS
- 10 APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
- 11 (D) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A SUCCESSOR IN THE EVENT OF A
- 12 VACANCY ON THE COMMISSION.
- 13 (E) From among its members, the Commission shall elect a
- 14 CHAIR, VICE CHAIR, AND ANY OTHER OFFICERS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT ITS
- 15 FUNCTIONS.
- 16 (F) THE MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION SHALL
- 17 PROVIDE STAFF FOR THE COMMISSION USING EXISTING RESOURCES.
- 18 (G) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION:
- 19 (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE
- 20 COMMISSION; BUT
- 21 (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE
- 22 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE
- 23 **BUDGET.**
- 24 (H) THE COMMISSION SHALL MEET AT LEAST FOUR TIMES EACH YEAR
- 25 AND MAY HOLD ADDITIONAL MEETINGS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CHAIR OR
- 26 AT THE REQUEST OF A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS.
- 27 (I) THE COMMISSION SHALL:
- 28 (1) PERFORM AN EVALUATION OF THE CURRENT STATE OF

- 6 (4) DETERMINE THE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH CREATING

- 8 IDENTIFY POTENTIAL FUNDING SOURCES FOR THESE COSTS:

- 18 SCHOLARS WHO CHOOSE TO PRACTICE MEDICINE IN RURAL COMMUNITIES IN
- 19 THE STATE;

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- 20 (9) IDENTIFY OPPORTUNITIES FOR COLLABORATIVE
- 21 AGREEMENTS BETWEEN RURAL HOSPITALS AFFILIATED WITH THE UNIVERSITY
- 22 OF MARYLAND MEDICAL SCHOOL HEALTH SYSTEM AND OTHER RURAL
- 23 HOSPITALS AND LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES THAT ARE NOT AFFILIATED WITH
- 24 THE SYSTEM BUT HAVE THE CAPACITY TO PROVIDE INTERNSHIP AND
- 25 RESIDENCY SUPPORT;
- 26 (10) DESIGN COLLABORATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMS FOR RURAL
- 27 MEDICAL SCHOLARS WHO WISH TO PURSUE OTHER MEDICAL PROFESSIONS,
- 28 INCLUDING PHARMACISTS, PHYSICAL THERAPISTS, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS,
- 29 AND NURSE PRACTITIONERS; AND
- 30 (11) DESIGN MENTORSHIP PROGRAMS FOR SECONDARY SCHOOL
- 31 STUDENTS FOR THE PREPARATION OF THESE STUDENTS TO ENTER MEDICAL
- 32 SCHOOL OR PURSUE OTHER MEDICAL PROFESSIONS.
  - (J) THE COMMISSION MAY:

1	(1) SEEK, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND FUNDS FROM ANY SOURCE,		
2	INCLUDING DONATIONS, STATE APPROPRIATIONS, AND FEDERAL GRANTS; AND		
3	(2) SEEK, ACCEPT, AND USE SERVICES FROM INDIVIDUALS,		
4	CORPORATIONS, AND GOVERNMENT ENTITIES.		
5	(K) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSION		
6	SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR, AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN		
7	ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE		
8	IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS SUBTITLE.		
9	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial		
10	members of the Family Medicine Rural Health Commission shall expire as follows:		
11	(1) two members in 2010; and		
12	(2) three members in 2011.		
13	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect		
14	October 1, 2009. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 years and, at the end of		
15	September 30, 2015, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act		
16	shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
