A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Lottery - Unanticipated Revenues - Public School Systems

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Comptroller to distribute certain unanticipated 4 lottery revenues to all the public school systems in the State; specifying that the 5 money distributed under this Act is intended to provide additional revenue for 6 public school systems and may not supplant any other appropriation to public 7 school systems; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the 8 distribution of lottery proceeds to public school systems in the State.

- 19 **(1)** on a pro rata basis for the daily and nondaily State lottery games, 20 the expenses of administering and operating the State lottery, as authorized under

- 22 then, except as provided in § 10–113.1 of the Family Law Article
- 23and § 11-618 of the Criminal Procedure Article, the holder of each winning ticket or
- 24 share.
