CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Workers' Compensation Commission - Authority - Employer Compliance

FOR the purpose of clarifying the authority of the Workers' Compensation Commission to conduct certain investigations and take certain other actions to determine whether an employer has complied with certain requirements regarding workers' compensation insurance; authorizing the Commission to issue penalties and other orders under certain circumstances; establishing certain penalties; requiring the Commission to notify certain employers that certain licenses or permits may be suspended under certain circumstances; providing for default in payment of compensation under certain circumstances; creating an enforceable lien under certain circumstances; authorizing the Uninsured Employers' Fund to bring civil action against an employer under certain circumstances; establishing joint and several liability for certain corporation officers and limited liability company members for certain violations; requiring the Commission to send a certain notice to certain licensing and permitting agencies; requiring certain units of the State, a county, or a municipal government to suspend the license or permit of certain employers under certain circumstances; requiring the Commission to file a list of certain violators with certain units of State government; prohibiting certain employers from entering into a contract with a public body under certain circumstances; increasing a certain assessment; requiring the Governor to include in the annual budget bill a certain amount for employment of a certain number of investigators and certain other positions; making the provisions of this Act severable; and generally relating to employer compliance and the authority of the Workers' Compensation Commission.
