- 5 (1) ON A DAY FOR WHICH THE FORECASTED HEAT INDEX IS 95 6 DEGREES FAHRENHEIT OR ABOVE; OR
- 7 (2) ON THE DAY IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING A DAY FOR WHICH THE 8 FORECASTED HEAT INDEX IS 95 DEGREES FAHRENHEIT OR ABOVE.
