Public Service Companies – Termination of Electric and Gas Service – Extreme Temperatures

- 4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a public service company from terminating electric or 5 gas service to a residential customer in a certain area because of nonpayment on 6 a day for which the forecasted high temperature in the area is at or below a certain temperature; prohibiting a public service company from terminating 7 8 electric service to a residential customer in a certain area because of 9 nonpayment on certain days if a day for which the forecasted heat index 10 temperature in the area is at or above a certain level; temperature; requiring the Public Service Commission to require certain public service companies to 11 12 designate certain weather station areas for certain purposes; providing for the 13 construction of this Act; requiring the Public Service Commission to adopt regulations to carry out this Act; and generally relating to public service 14 companies and the termination of electric and gas service to residential 1516 customers.
