SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective for a period of 4 years from the date it is enacted and, at the end of the 4–year period, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
