A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Election Law – Petition Signatures

3 FOR the purpose of repealing provisions of law that require an individual to sign the 4 individual's name on a petition in a certain manner; providing that the petition signature of an individual shall be validated and counted if the identity of the 5 individual reasonably can be determined in accordance with certain 6 7 requirements; clarifying a certain provision of law relating to the residence of a 8 petition signer; prohibiting an election authority from invalidating a petition 9 signature under certain circumstances; requiring an individual's name on a petition to match exactly the individual's surname of registration; providing for 10 the application of this Act; making this Act an emergency measure; and 11 12 generally relating to petition signature requirements.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 (2) NOTWITHSTANDING PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN 4 INDIVIDUAL'S NAME ON THE PETITION MUST MATCH EXACTLY THE 5 INDIVIDUAL'S SURNAME OF REGISTRATION.

(1) A signature may be removed:

(i) by the signer upon written application to the election
authority with which the petition will be filed if the application is received by the
election authority prior to the filing of that signature; or

10 (ii) prior to the filing of that signature, by the circulator who 11 attested to that signature or by the sponsor of the petition, if it is concluded that the 12 signature does not satisfy the requirements of this title.

13 (2) A signature removed pursuant to paragraph (1)(ii) of this 14 subsection may not be included in the number of signatures stated on the information 15 page included in the petition.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be 17 construed to apply retroactively and shall be applied to and interpreted to affect 18 signatures submitted to the State Board of Elections or to a county board of elections 19 in the State on or after December 1, 2008, for any petition authorized by law.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
