

CHAPTER 723

(House Bill 1385)

AN ACT concerning

Juvenile Services – Employee Criminal History Record Information – Initial Criminal History Records Check and Disclosure of New Information

FOR the purpose of requiring the Criminal Justice Information System Central Repository to provide to the Department of Juvenile Services and ~~the employee any changes in the employee's criminal history after the initial criminal history records check~~ an employee of the Department a revised printed statement of the employee's criminal history record information under certain circumstances; altering the time within which the Department is required to apply for an initial criminal history records check for an employee; and generally relating to juvenile services.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Human Services

9–209.

(a) (1) ~~Within the first month~~ **ON OR BEFORE THE FIRST DAY** of employment with the Department, the Department shall apply to the Criminal Justice Information System Central Repository in the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services for a federal and State criminal history records check for each employee of the Department.

(2) The Criminal Justice Information System Central Repository shall provide the requested information in accordance with Title 10, Subtitle 2 of the Criminal Procedure Article.

(3) IF CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION IS REPORTED TO THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL REPOSITORY AFTER THE DATE OF THE CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECK, THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL REPOSITORY SHALL PROVIDE TO

THE DEPARTMENT AND THE EMPLOYEE A REVISED PRINTED STATEMENT OF THE EMPLOYEE'S CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2009.
