# State Government - Commemorative Day - Health Improvement and Disease Prevention Day

This bill requires the Governor to annually proclaim the second Wednesday in May of each year as Health Improvement and Disease Prevention Day. The proclamation must urge citizens of the State to combat childhood obesity, reduce smoking and tobacco use, promote senior fitness and wellness, promote adult physical activity, and promote healthy weight loss.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** Commemorating Health Improvement and Disease Prevention Day will not affect government finances.

Local Effect: None.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** Six official commemorative days and two months are recognized in State law as shown in **Exhibit 1**. The Governor also must issue a proclamation each year encouraging citizens and other individuals to observe a moment of silence at 3 p.m. on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and commemorate the heroic acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in the U.S. armed forces.
