## Election Law - Gubernatorial Primary Election - Date

This bill moves the date of the gubernatorial primary election from the second Tuesday after the first Monday in September to the second Tuesday after the first Monday in June.

## Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill's change will cause State election expenditures associated with the 2010 gubernatorial primary election to be incurred in FY 2010, instead of in FY 2011. The change will accelerate preparation for the 2010 election cycle, including the expected implementation of a new voting system, which presumably may affect overall expenditures for the 2010 elections. Any impact, however, cannot be reliably estimated at this time.

Local Effect: Local government expenditures will similarly shift to FY 2010. It is assumed overall local government expenditures for the 2010 elections may also be affected by an accelerated preparation for the 2010 election cycle.

Small Business Effect: None.

## Analysis

Current Law: The gubernatorial primary election is held on the second Tuesday after the first Monday in September and the general election is held on the Tuesday following the first Monday in November.

Background: Appendix 1 shows the dates of state primary elections held in 2006.

Prior Introductions: HB 1254 of 2007 received a hearing in the House Ways and Means Committee, but no further action was taken.
