#### Wild Waterfowl Hunting - Calvert and St. Mary's Counties

This bill decreases the minimum distance, from 800 to 400 yards, that a person hunting wild waterfowl in the waters of Calvert and St. Mary's counties must be from shore while standing in water on the natural bottom, from a boat that is drifting or being sculled, or from a boat that is anchored, except when the person is within the boundaries of a municipal corporation in either county. In those instances, the person must be at least 800 yards from shore, including shore emerging at mean low water.

### **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: The bill's changes can be handled with existing budgeted resources.

**Local Effect:** The bill does not directly affect local operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

#### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** By regulation, the Department of Natural Resources establishes an offshore waterfowl hunting zone. Within this zone, a person may hunt waterfowl while standing on the natural bottom, from a boat that is drifting or being sculled, or from a boat that is anchored. In most areas, a person must be at least 800 yards from shore. In specified waters, including the waters of Harford and Baltimore counties, the minimum required distance is 400 yards.
