# FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE Revised

House Bill 1105 (Delegate Frush, et al.)

Environmental Matters Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

#### **Private Wastewater Treatment Act of 2009**

This bill prohibits the installation of an individual sewerage system for residential use unless an existing on-site sewage disposal (septic) system fails and cannot be repaired or replaced by any means and the installation is approved by the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE). An "individual sewerage system" is defined as a privately owned system of sewers, piping, and treatment tanks, or other facilities, that serves only a single lot for the disposal of sewage and discharges to the surface waters of the State.

## **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: The bill does not materially affect State operations or finances.

**Local Effect:** The bill does not materially affect local government operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** The installation of an individual sewerage system is prohibited by regulation from being permitted where an adequate community sewerage facility is available.

**Background:** MDE advises that there are likely fewer than five individual sewerage systems installed for residential use in the State. These systems are substantially more expensive than a septic system.
