Senate Bill 76 (Chair, Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee)(By Request - Departmental - Baltimore City Community College)

Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs

Ways and Means

Baltimore City Community College - Term of Student Trustee

This departmental bill conforms the beginning and ending days of the term for the student member of the Baltimore City Community College (BCCC) Board of Trustees with those of the other trustees. Student trustees will begin their one-year term on July 1 rather than June 1.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2009.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. Altering the beginning and ending days of the term for the student member of the BCCC Board of Trustees does not impact State finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: BCCC has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). Legislative Services concurs with this assessment.

Analysis

Current Law: The college trustees begin their term on July 1 of the year in which they are appointed. The student trustee serves for a one-year term, currently set from June 1 to May 31.

Background: New trustees other than the student trustee currently have orientation and begin their work at the board's annual retreat, held in July of each year. For consistency

and efficiency, the college seeks to conform the beginning dates of the student's term to coincide with the term of other trustees.
