Estates - Disqualification - Conviction for Unlawfully Obtaining Property of Vulnerable Adult

This bill establishes that a person who is convicted of unlawfully obtaining property from a vulnerable adult is disqualified, to the extent of the person's failure to restore the property or its value, from inheriting, taking, enjoying, receiving, or otherwise benefiting from the estate, insurance proceeds, or property of the vulnerable adult, whether by operation of law or pursuant to a legal document executed or entered into by the vulnerable adult before the person was convicted. The person convicted of unlawfully obtaining property from a vulnerable adult has the burden of proof to establish that the person has made complete restitution. The bill only applies prospectively.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: The bill is not expected to materially affect local government operations or

finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: A person may not knowingly and willfully obtain by deception, intimidation, or undue influence the property of an individual that the person knows or reasonably should know is a vulnerable adult with the intent to deprive the vulnerable adult of his or her property. A violator is subject to specified criminal penalties.

A conviction disqualifies the defendant from inheriting, taking, enjoying, receiving, or otherwise benefiting from the estate, insurance proceeds, or property of the vulnerable adult, whether by operation of law or pursuant to a legal document executed or entered into by the vulnerable adult before the defendant was convicted and made full restoration of the property taken or its value.
