<u>AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 513</u> (First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 2, strike "- Vessels"; in line 3, after "Waters" insert "<u>-</u> <u>Reports</u>"; strike beginning with "clarifying" in line 4 down through "contingency" in line 13 and substitute "<u>requiring the Department of Natural Resources to provide</u> <u>certain reports to the Governor and General Assembly, on or before certain dates, on</u> <u>the establishment of a no-discharge zone in all waters of the State; requiring a certain</u> <u>report to include certain information</u>"; and in line 14, strike "discharge" though the first "the" and substitute "<u>study of establishing a no-discharge zone in</u>".

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On pages 1 through 5, strike in their entirety the lines beginning with line 16 on page 1 through line 14 on page 5, inclusive, and substitute:

"<u>SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF</u> <u>MARYLAND, That:</u>

(a) <u>The Department of Natural Resources shall:</u>

(1) on or before December 1, 2010, provide an interim report to the Governor and General Assembly, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, that includes recommendations for initiating a no-discharge zone in all waters of the State; and

(2) on or before December 1, 2011, provide a final report to the Governor and General Assembly, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, on the establishment of a no-discharge zone in all waters of the State.

(Over)

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(b) The final report required under subsection (a)(2) of this section shall include:

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(1) an analysis of the environmental impact of pollution from Type I and Type II marine sanitation devices on waters of the State;

(2) an analysis of the adequacy and availability of pump-out facilities for recreational and commercial vessels in and along waters of the State;

(3) recommendations on the enforcement actions, including penalties, that would be necessary to implement a no-discharge zone in all waters of the State;

(4) information regarding the costs associated with the installation of holding tanks on recreational and commercial vessels; and

(5) <u>a review of relevant federal law related to establishing a no-</u> <u>discharge zone in all waters of the State.</u>

<u>SECTION 2.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 2010.".
