AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 99  
(Third Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 24, after “requirements;” insert “requiring certain contracts to be open to inspection by a local law enforcement agency under certain circumstances; prohibiting certain contracts from being open to public inspection without the consent of certain junk dealers or scrap metal processors;”.

AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 9, in line 20, strike “AND”; and in line 24, after “INDIVIDUAL” insert “;  
AND

**8. AN ELECTRONIC SCAN OR PHOTOCOPY OF THE VALID STATE-ISSUED PHOTO ID UNDER ITEM 7 OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH**.

On page 11, in line 19, after “(F)” insert “(1)”; in lines 21, 22, and 23, strike “(1)”, “(2)”, and “(3)”, respectively, and substitute “(I)”, “(II)”, and “(III)”, respectively; and strike beginning with “WHOM” in line 23 down through “CONTRACT” in line 25 and substitute “A VALID BUSINESS LICENSE THAT HAS ENTERED INTO A WRITTEN CONTRACT WITH A JUNK DEALER OR SCRAP METAL PROCESSOR WHO HAS PROVIDED TO THE PRIMARY LAW ENFORCEMENT UNIT:

**1. THE NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS OF THE COMMERCIAL ENTERPRISE; AND**

**2. THE TYPE OF JUNK OR SCRAP METAL SUBJECT TO THE CONTRACT.**

(Over)

(2) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, A CONTRACT UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(III) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE OPEN TO INSPECTION BY A LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY ON THE PREMISES OF THE JUNK DEALER OR SCRAP METAL PROCESSOR DURING BUSINESS HOURS.

(II) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER LAW, A CONTRACT OPEN TO INSPECTION BY A LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS PARAGRAPH MAY NOT BE OPEN FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE JUNK DEALER OR SCRAP METAL PROCESSOR”.
