A BILL ENTITLED

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Election Law - United States Senate - Special Election to Fill Vacancy

3 FOR the purpose of altering the process for filling a vacancy in the office of United 4 States Senator; repealing the authority of the Governor to make an 5 appointment to fill a vacancy in the office of United States Senator under 6 certain circumstances; requiring the Governor to issue a proclamation to call for 7 a special primary election and special general election to fill a vacancy in the 8 office of United States Senator under certain circumstances; specifying the time 9 when a special election to fill a vacancy in the office of United States Senator 10 shall be held; authorizing the Governor to appoint an individual to fill a vacancy in the office of United States Senator temporarily under certain circumstances; 11 12 and generally relating to filling a vacancy in the office of United States Senator.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

4	(1) to fill a vacancy in the office of Representative in Congress; [or]

- 8 (II) A SPECIAL GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON A DATE 9 THAT IS NOT LESS THAN 60 BUT NOT MORE THAN 90 DAYS AFTER THE DATE OF 10 THE SPECIAL PRIMARY ELECTION.
- 11 (2) If a regularly scheduled election will be held 12 During the period in which a special election is required to be held 13 Under Paragraph (1) of this subsection, the Governor shall by 14 Proclamation call the special election to be held on the date of 15 The regularly scheduled election.
- 16 (3) IF THE VACANCY OCCURS ON A DATE THAT IS LESS THAN 60
 17 DAYS BEFORE OR IS ON OR AFTER THE DATE OF THE PRIMARY ELECTION IN THE
 18 YEAR IN WHICH A CANDIDATE TO FILL THE OFFICE IS REGULARLY ELECTED,
 19 THE GOVERNOR MAY NOT CALL A SPECIAL ELECTION.

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- (b) (1) [If the vacancy occurs before the date that is 21 days before the deadline for filing certificates of candidacy for the next succeeding regular statewide election, the Governor shall issue a proclamation immediately after the occurrence of the vacancy declaring that a special primary election and a special general election shall be held at the same time as the next regular statewide primary election and regular statewide general election] IF THERE IS A VACANCY IN THE OFFICE OF UNITED STATES SENATOR, THE GOVERNOR MAY, AT LEAST 5 BUT NOT LATER THAN 30 DAYS AFTER THE DATE OF THE VACANCY, APPOINT A QUALIFIED INDIVIDUAL TO FILL THE VACANCY TEMPORARILY UNTIL THE RESULTS OF ANY SPECIAL ELECTION CALLED TO FILL THE VACANCY ARE CERTIFIED.
- 30 (2) IF THE GOVERNOR DOES NOT BY PROCLAMATION CALL A
 31 SPECIAL ELECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (A)(3) OF THIS SECTION,
 32 AN INDIVIDUAL APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR TO FILL THE VACANCY IN THE
 33 OFFICE OF UNITED STATES SENATOR SHALL SERVE TEMPORARILY UNTIL THE
 34 RESULTS OF THE NEXT GENERAL ELECTION ARE CERTIFIED.
