1 AN ACT concerning

Education – Public High Schools and Public High School Students – Data Collection System

FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to develop a certain data collection system on or before a certain date; identifying the purpose of a certain provision of law; and generally relating to public high schools and public high school students.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10 [(d)] (E) (1) The county boards and the Department may develop and 11 implement additional indicators to collect, maintain, analyze, and publicly report data 12 regarding alternative high school completions.

13 (2) The Department shall ensure that the information collected under 14 paragraph (1) of this subsection is comparable for public schools and local school 15 systems in the State.

16 [(e)] (F) The Department shall:

17 (1) Implement training for administrators and other personnel 18 responsible for collecting, maintaining, analyzing, and publicly reporting data 19 regarding four-year cohorts and graduation rates;

20 (2) Implement a standard process for verifying the accuracy of data 21 including:

(i) Statistical checks and analyses; and

(ii) On–site audits of record–keeping procedures;

(3) Implement a public awareness campaign including outreach to
civic associations, community-based groups, and parent organizations and the
solicitation of suggestions and community support regarding the need for collecting,
maintaining, analyzing, and publicly reporting accurate data regarding four-year
cohorts and graduation rates;

(4) Provide technical support to the county boards with collecting,
 maintaining, analyzing, and publicly reporting graduation rate data; and

- (5) Serve as a central repository for this data.

32 [(f)] (G) (1) On or before November 1 of each year, the State Board shall 33 report to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the 34 General Assembly, regarding:
