- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Agriculture

- 15 6-201.
- 16 (p) "Low phosphorous fertilizer" means fertilizer:
- 17 (1) Containing not more than [5%] **0.5%** of available phosphoric acid 18 (H₃PO₄); and

19 (2) That has an application rate not to exceed 0.25 pound of available 20 phosphoric acid $(H_3PO_4)/1,000$ square feet/application and 0.5 pound of available 21 phosphoric acid $(H_3PO_4)/1,000$ square feet/year.

1 (e) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, on or after 2 April 1, 2011, a lawn fertilizer with an available phosphoric acid (H_3PO_4) content 3 greater than [5%] **0.5%**:

(i) May not be labeled for use on established lawns or grass;

(ii) May not be labeled with spreader settings; and

6 (iii) Shall be marked with the words "NOT FOR USE ON 7 ESTABLISHED LAWNS OR GRASS" in at least a three-quarter inch font and in a 8 legible and conspicuous manner on the front side of the container.

9 (2) This subsection does not apply to seed starter fertilizer for use on 10 newly established lawns or turf.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2010.
