20	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 1 (e) The subsidy that a nonprofit health service plan is required to provide to 2 the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program under subsection (d)(1)(iii) of this 3 section may not exceed:
- 4 (1) for the period of January 1, 2006 through June 30, 2006, 5 \$8,000,000;
- 6 (2) for fiscal years 2008 through [2010] **2013**, \$14,000,000; and
- 7 (3) for any year, the value of the nonprofit health service plan's 8 premium tax exemption under § 6–101(b) of this article.

 - SECTION 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 13 (1) No later than June 1, 2003, the Secretary of Health and Mental
 14 Hygiene and the carrier that is required to offer the Short-Term Prescription Drug
 15 Subsidy Plan under Title 15, Subtitle 6 of the Health General Article shall transfer
 16 all Plan records, data, and other information necessary to operate and administer the
 17 Senior Prescription Drug Program established under this Act to the Board of the
 18 Maryland Health Insurance Plan.
- 19 (2) Each individual enrolled in the Short-Term Prescription Drug 20 Subsidy Plan, established under Title 15, Subtitle 6 of the Health – General Article, on 21 June 30, 2003 shall, at the option of the enrollee and subject to the payment of all 22 necessary premiums and copayments, be automatically enrolled in the Senior 23 Prescription Drug Program established under this Act.
- 24 (3) It is the intent of the General Assembly that the transition of enrollees from the Short–Term Prescription Drug Subsidy Plan to the Senior Prescription Drug Program be accomplished without interruption of benefits for enrollees.
- 28 (4) Subsidies shall be offered to enrollees through the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program established under Title 14, Subtitle 5, Part II of the Insurance Article beginning January 1, 2006. At the end of December 31, [2010] 2012, the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program established under Title 14, Subtitle 5, Part II, as amended, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
- 33 (5) Beginning April 1, 2003, the carrier required to offer the 34 Short-Term Prescription Drug Subsidy Plan under Title 15, Subtitle 6 of the Health 35 General Article and the Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program under Title 14,

- 1 Subtitle 5 of the Insurance Article shall subsidize the Plan and beginning January 1,
- 2 2006, the Program, using the value of the carrier's premium tax exemption.
- 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 4 October 1, 2010.
