A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Department of the Environment – Grants – Small Businesses and Certified Minority Business Enterprises

4 FOR the purpose of requiring applicants for certain financial assistance from the $\mathbf{5}$ Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund to demonstrate 6 that certain steps were taken to include certain small businesses and certain 7 certified minority business enterprises; authorizing the Department of the 8 Environment to withhold certain financial assistance under certain 9 circumstances; establishing a threshold to require grantees that receive grants that exceed a certain amount from a certain fund to take steps to include 10 certain small businesses and certain certified minority business enterprises; 11 12and generally relating to small businesses and certified minority business 13 enterprise participation and the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund. 14

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (a) (1) There is a Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source 2 Fund.

3 (2) The Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund 4 shall be maintained and administered by the Administration in accordance with the 5 provisions of this subtitle and such rules or Program directives as the Secretary or the 6 Board may from time to time prescribe.

7 (b) The purpose of the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint 8 Source Fund is to provide financial assistance for the implementation of urban and 9 suburban stormwater management practices, and stream and wetland restoration.

10 (c) There shall be deposited in the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays11 Nonpoint Source Fund:

12 (1) Money distributed to the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays 13 Nonpoint Source Fund under § 8–2A–04 of the Natural Resources Article and 14 appropriated in the State budget for the Fund;

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(2) Net proceeds of bonds issued by the Administration;

16 (3) Interest or other income earned on the investment of moneys in the17 Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund; and

18 (4) Any other moneys from any other source accepted for the benefit of19 the Fund.

(d) (1) The Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund
is a special, continuing, nonlapsing fund that is not subject to § 7–302 of the State
Finance and Procurement Article.

23 (2) Money in the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint
 24 Source Fund may not revert or be transferred to the General Fund of the State.

(3) Subject to the provisions of any applicable bond resolution
regarding the holding or application of amounts in the Chesapeake and Atlantic
Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund, the Treasurer shall separately hold, and the
Comptroller shall account for, the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint
Source Fund.

30 (4) Subject to the provision of any applicable bond resolution
31 governing the investment of amounts in the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays
32 Nonpoint Source Fund, the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source
33 Fund shall be invested and reinvested in the same manner as other State funds.

34 (5) Any investment earnings shall be retained to the credit of the35 Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund.

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1 (6) The Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund 2 shall be subject to audit by the Office of Legislative Audits as provided under § 2–1220 3 of the State Government Article.

4 (7) The Administration may from time to time establish accounts and 5 subaccounts within the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund 6 as may be deemed desirable to effectuate the purposes of this subtitle, to comply with 7 the provisions of any bond resolution, or to meet any requirement or rules or program 8 directives established by the Secretary or the Board.

9 (8) The Administration shall operate the Chesapeake and Atlantic 10 Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund in accordance with §§ 9–1607 through 9–1622 of 11 this subtitle.

12 (e) The Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund shall 13 be used:

14 (1) To award grants for up to 100 percent of project costs relating to 15 planning, design, and construction of urban and suburban stormwater management 16 practices, and stream and wetland restoration;

17 (2) As a source of revenue or security for the payment of principal and
18 interest on bonds issued by the Administration if the proceeds of the sale of such bonds
19 will be deposited in the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund;

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- (3) For costs associated with the issuance of bonds;

(4) To earn interest on the Chesapeake and Atlantic Coastal Bays
 Nonpoint Source Fund accounts; and

23 (5) For the reasonable costs of administering the Chesapeake and
 24 Atlantic Coastal Bays Nonpoint Source Fund.

25 (F) (1) (I) IN THIS SUBSECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE 26 THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

27 (II) "CERTIFIED MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE" HAS 28 THE MEANING STATED IN § 14–301 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND 29 PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

30 (III) "SMALL BUSINESS" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN 31 §14–501 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

32 (2) FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE OVER \$500,000 AWARDED 33 UNDER THE FUND, THE GRANTEE SHALL DEMONSTRATE, TO THE SATISFACTION 34 OF THE DEPARTMENT, THAT STEPS WERE TAKEN TO INCLUDE SMALL

BUSINESSES, CERTIFIED MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES, AND CERTIFIED
 MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES CLASSIFIED AS WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESSES
 BY:

4 (I) PLACING SMALL BUSINESSES, CERTIFIED MINORITY
5 BUSINESS ENTERPRISES, AND CERTIFIED MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES
6 CLASSIFIED AS WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESSES ON SOLICITATION LISTS;

7 (II) ASSURING THAT SMALL BUSINESSES, CERTIFIED 8 MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES, AND CERTIFIED MINORITY BUSINESS 9 ENTERPRISES CLASSIFIED AS WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESSES ARE SOLICITED 10 WHENEVER THEY ARE POTENTIAL SOURCES;

11 (III) DIVIDING TOTAL REQUIREMENTS, WHEN 12 ECONOMICALLY FEASIBLE, INTO SMALL TASKS OR QUANTITIES TO PERMIT 13 MAXIMUM PARTICIPATION OF SMALL BUSINESSES, CERTIFIED MINORITY 14 BUSINESS ENTERPRISES, AND CERTIFIED MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES 15 CLASSIFIED AS WOMEN–OWNED BUSINESSES;

16 (IV) ESTABLISHING DELIVERY SCHEDULES, WHERE THE 17 REQUIREMENT PERMITS, THAT ENCOURAGE PARTICIPATION BY SMALL 18 BUSINESSES, CERTIFIED MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES, CLASSIFIED AS 19 WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESSES; AND

20 (V) USING THE SERVICES AND ASSISTANCE OF THE 21 DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF 22 MINORITY AFFAIRS IN IDENTIFYING AND SOLICITING SMALL BUSINESSES, 23 CERTIFIED MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISES, AND CERTIFIED MINORITY 24 BUSINESS ENTERPRISES CLASSIFIED AS WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESSES.

(G) IF THE STEPS REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (F) OF THIS SECTION
 ARE NOT DEMONSTRATED TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE DEPARTMENT, THE
 DEPARTMENT MAY WITHHOLD FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE PROJECT.
