A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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State Board for Professional Engineers

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board for Professional Engineers to adopt 4 regulations to require a demonstration of professional competency as a $\mathbf{5}$ condition of renewal of a license to practice engineering under certain 6 circumstances; providing for implementation of the continuing competency 7 program on a phased-in basis; authorizing the Board to issue certain retired 8 status licenses; prohibiting a holder of a retired status license from practicing 9 engineering; authorizing the holder of a retired status license to use a certain designation; authorizing the Board to reactivate a retired status license under 10 certain circumstances; and generally relating to the practice of professional 11 12engineering.

- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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2 (a) Unless a license is renewed for a 2-year term as provided in this section, 3 the license expires on the first June 30 that comes:

4 (1) after the effective date of the license; and
5 (2) in an even-numbered year.

6 (b) (1) At least 1 month before a license expires, the Board shall mail to 7 the licensee, at the last known address of the licensee:

- 8 (i) a renewal application form; and
- 9 (ii) a notice that states:
 - 1. the date on which the current license expires;

11 2. the date by which the Board must receive the renewal
12 application for the renewal to be issued and mailed before the license expires; and

13 3. the amount of the license fee.

14 (2) The failure of a licensee to receive the notice for which this 15 subsection provides does not prevent the license from expiring as specified under 16 subsection (a) of this section.

17 (c) Before a license expires, the licensee periodically may renew it for an 18 additional 2-year term, if the licensee:

- 19 (1) otherwise is entitled to be licensed;
- 20 (2) pays to the Board a license fee set by the Board; and

21 (3) submits to the Board a renewal application on the form that the 22 Board provides.

- (d) (1) The Board shall renew the license of and issue a renewal certificate
 to each licensee who meets the requirements of this section.
- (2) The Board shall include on each renewal certificate that the Board(2) issues:
- 27 (i) the date on which the current license expires; and

(ii) the signatures of the chairman and secretary of the Board,under seal of the Board.

1 (e) The Secretary may determine that licenses issued under this subtitle 2 shall expire on a staggered basis.

3 (F) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO REQUIRE A 4 DEMONSTRATION OF CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCY FOR A 5 LICENSEE AS A CONDITION OF RENEWAL OF A LICENSE UNDER THIS SECTION IN 6 ACCORDANCE WITH THE FOLLOWING:

7 (1) CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS
8 DO NOT APPLY TO THE FIRST RENEWAL OF A LICENSE;

9 (2) IF A LICENSE EXPIRES ON OR BEFORE SEPTEMBER 30, 2011, A 10 LICENSEE IS NOT REQUIRED TO FULFILL THE CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL 11 COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS;

12 (3) IF A LICENSE EXPIRES BETWEEN OCTOBER 1, 2011, AND 13 SEPTEMBER 30, 2012, A LICENSEE IS REQUIRED TO FULFILL 50% OF THE 14 CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCY REQUIREMENT AS PROVIDED IN THE 15 REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD UNDER THIS SUBSECTION; AND

16 (4) IF A LICENSE EXPIRES ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2012, A
17 LICENSEE IS REQUIRED TO FULFILL THE FULL CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL
18 COMPETENCY REQUIREMENT AS PROVIDED IN THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY
19 THE BOARD UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

21 (A) THE BOARD MAY ISSUE A RETIRED STATUS LICENSE TO AN 22 INDIVIDUAL WHO:

23 (1) IS CURRENTLY LICENSED IN MARYLAND AS A PROFESSIONAL
 24 ENGINEER;

25(2)HAS BEEN LICENSED AS A PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER FOR AT26LEAST 25 YEARS, OF WHICH AT LEAST 5 YEARS WERE IN MARYLAND;

27(3) IS NOT THE SUBJECT OF A PENDING DISCIPLINARY ACTION28RELATED TO THE PRACTICE OF ENGINEERING IN THIS OR ANY OTHER STATE;

29 (4) SUBMITS TO THE BOARD AN APPLICATION ON THE FORM 30 APPROVED BY THE BOARD; AND

31 (5) PAYS TO THE BOARD A FEE AS SET BY THE BOARD.

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1 (B) (1) THE HOLDER OF A RETIRED STATUS LICENSE ISSUED UNDER 2 THIS SECTION MAY NOT ENGAGE IN THE PRACTICE OF PROFESSIONAL 3 ENGINEERING.

4 (2) THE HOLDER OF A RETIRED STATUS LICENSE SHALL BE 5 PERMITTED TO USE THE DESIGNATION OF "PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER, 6 RETIRED".

7 (C) THE BOARD MAY REACTIVATE THE LICENSE OF THE HOLDER OF A 8 RETIRED STATUS LICENSE IF THAT INDIVIDUAL:

9 (1) SUBMITS TO THE BOARD AN APPLICATION FOR REACTIVATION 10 ON THE FORM APPROVED BY THE BOARD;

11(2) MEETS ALL APPLICABLE CONTINUING COMPETENCY12REQUIREMENTS DETERMINED BY THE BOARD;

13 (3) IS NOT THE SUBJECT OF A PENDING DISCIPLINARY ACTION
 14 RELATED TO THE PRACTICE OF ENGINEERING IN THIS OR ANY OTHER STATE;
 15 AND

16 (4) PAYS TO THE BOARD A REACTIVATION FEE AS SET BY THE 17 BOARD.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect19 July 1, 2010.

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
