1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Outstanding Arrest Warrants – Drivers’ Licenses and Vehicle Registrations**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of an outstanding warrant for arrest for
4 purposes of certain provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law governing
5 suspension of drivers’ licenses and vehicle registrations under certain
6 circumstances; and generally relating to suspension of drivers’ licenses and
7 vehicle registrations based on outstanding warrants for arrest under certain
8 circumstances.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 **Article – Transportation**

2 The Administration shall refuse to register or transfer the registration of any
3 vehicle if:

4 (8) Subject to § 13-406.1 of this subtitle, the applicant is named in an
5 outstanding arrest warrant;

6 13-406.1.

7 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

8 (3) “Outstanding warrant” means an arrest warrant that:

9 (i) A law enforcement agency has attempted, but failed, to
10 serve on the individual named in the warrant due to the inability to locate the
11 individual; and

12 (ii) Is at least [31] ~~91~~ 61 days old.

13 (b) Subject to subsection (h) of this section, on notification by a law
14 enforcement agency that an applicant for vehicle registration is named in an
15 outstanding warrant, the Administration shall refuse to register or transfer the
16 registration of any vehicle owned by the applicant.

18 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

19 (3) “Outstanding warrant” has the meaning stated in § 13-406.1(a)(3)
20 of this article.

21 (b) Subject to subsection (h) of this section, on notification by a law
22 enforcement agency that an individual is named in an outstanding warrant, the
23 Administration shall suspend the individual’s license or privilege to drive in the State.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
25 October 1, 2010.
