4 FOR the purpose of limiting to a person charged by indictment or criminal information $\mathbf{5}$ with a crime triable in circuit court and convicted of that crime the authority to 6 file a petition for writ of actual innocence under certain circumstances; $\overline{7}$ requiring a certain person who files a petition for writ of actual innocence to 8 notify the State of the filing in a certain manner; authorizing the State to file a 9 response to a petition for writ of actual innocence within a certain period of 10 time; requiring that the victim or victim's representative be notified of a hearing 11 on a petition for writ of actual innocence before the hearing is held; establishing 12that a victim or victim's representative has the right to attend a hearing on a 13petition for writ of actual innocence; repealing a provision of law authorizing the court to dismiss a certain petition without a hearing if the court finds that the 14

24 [(e)] (G) A petitioner in a proceeding under this section has the burden of 25 proof.

26(1)WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE COURT PASSES AN ORDER IN27ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION, THE STATE OR THE PETITIONER MAY28APPEAL THE ORDER TO THE COURT OF SPECIAL APPEALS.
