2 Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2010, 3 and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006,

4 2007, 2008, and 2009

FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of One Billion, Seventeen Million, Five Hundred Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$1,017,575,000), the proceeds to be used for certain necessary building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of this State, for acquiring certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to the requirement that certain grantees provide and expend certain matching funds by certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan; authorizing the creation of State Debt to be issued in 2011, the proceeds to be used for certain purposes; authorizing the creation of State Debt to be issued in 2012, the proceeds to be used for certain purposes; imposing a certain tax on all assessable property in the State; requiring that certain grantees convey certain easements under certain circumstances to the Maryland Historical Trust; authorizing certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans to be expended for other public projects; altering certain requirements for certain programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; providing that the authorizations of State Debt in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans be reduced by certain amounts; providing for certain additional information to be detailed about each project in the capital program; requiring that certain projects be constructed at certain locations; repealing certain requirements for certain appropriations; authorizing premiums from the sale of State bonds in certain fiscal years to remain in or be transferred to a certain fund and to be used for certain capital projects under certain circumstances; requiring the Comptroller to make certain transfers, adjustments, and reconciliations; providing for a delayed effective date for

- (4) An annual tax is imposed on all assessable property in the State in rate and amount sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds, as and when due and until paid in full. The principal shall be discharged within 15 years after the date of issue of the bonds.
