1 AN ACT concerning

Delegate Howard P. Rawlings Educational Excellence Award – Qualifications Study Abroad Programs

 P. Rawlings Educational Excellence Award remains qualified for the award if
 the individual is accepted in a certain study abroad program under certain
 circumstances; and generally relating to qualifications for the Delegate Howard
 P. Rawlings Educational Excellence Award.

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Education

- 18 (a) Subject to subsection (d) of this section, each recipient of a Delegate19 Howard P. Rawlings Educational Excellence Award shall:
- 20 (1) [Be] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS 21 SECTION, BE accepted for admission in the regular undergraduate program at an 22 eligible institution or be enrolled in a 2-year associate degree program in which the 23 course work is acceptable for transfer credit for an accredited baccalaureate program 24 in an eligible institution;

8 (E) A STUDENT WHO QUALIFIES FOR EITHER A GUARANTEED ACCESS 9 GRANT OR EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE GRANT UNDER THIS SUBTITLE AND IS 10 REGULARLY ENROLLED IN AN ELIGIBLE INSTITUTION SHALL CONTINUE TO BE 11 ELIGIBLE FOR THE GRANT IF:

12(1) THE STUDENT IS ACCEPTED IN A STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM13FACILITATED BY AN INELIGIBLE INSTITUTION; AND

14(2)THE STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM LOCATION IS NOT OFFERED BY15ANY OTHER ELIGIBLE INSTITUTION IN THE STATE.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 17 July 1, 2010.
