(1) $\mathbf{2}$ "9-1-1 system" has the meaning stated in § 1-301 of the Public (2)3 Safety Article. 4 "Text messaging device" means a hand held device used to send a (3) $\mathbf{5}$ text message or an electronic message via a short message service, wireless telephone 6 service, or electronic communication network. 7(b) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, a person may not use a text 8 messaging device to write [or send], SEND, OR READ a text message while operating a 9 motor vehicle in motion or in the travel portion of the roadway. 10 (c) This section does not apply to the use of: 11 (1)A global positioning system; or 12(2)A text messaging device to contact a 9–1–1 system. 27 - 101.13It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the 14(a) Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation: 1516(1)Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any other law of this State; or 1718 (2)Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of 19the Maryland Vehicle Law. 20(b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a 21misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is 22subject to a fine of not more than \$500. 23SECTION 2.
