- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13
- MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 14

- 17 The Board shall determine the qualifications necessary for an (a) (1) individual to lawfully engage in the practice of mortuary science or funeral direction 18
- 19 and to operate a funeral establishment within this State.
- 20 Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, to qualify for a (2)21 mortician or funeral director license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets
- 22 the requirements of this section.

- 1 (b) The Board shall examine all applications for licensure for the practice of 2 mortuary science or funeral direction and shall issue the mortician or funeral director 3 license to an individual who:
 - (1) Is judged to be of good moral character;
- 5 (2) Has completed not less than 1 year and not more than 2 years of 6 licensed apprenticeship, unless the Board allowed extensions for additional 1-year 7 terms;
- 8 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, has graduated with 9 an associate of arts degree in mortuary science or its equivalent from a school 10 accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education or approved by the 11 Board, or has acquired at least an associate of arts degree and completed a course in 12 mortuary science that is accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service 13 Education or approved by the Board;
- 14 (4) [Has] FOR AN INDIVIDUAL APPLYING FOR A LICENSE TO
 15 PRACTICE AS A MORTICIAN, passed the national board examination administered by
 16 the Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards of the United States;
- 17 (5) FOR AN INDIVIDUAL APPLYING FOR A LICENSE TO PRACTICE
 18 AS A FUNERAL DIRECTOR, PASSED THE ARTS AND SCIENCES STATE BOARD
 19 EXAMINATIONS, ADMINISTERED BY THE CONFERENCE OF FUNERAL SERVICE
 20 EXAMINING BOARDS OF THE UNITED STATES;
- 21 **(6)** Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, has passed a written examination on Maryland law and regulations governing the practice of mortuary science and a practical examination demonstrating competency in the preparation of dead human bodies for final disposition and sanitary science; and
- 25 **[**(6)**] (7)** Has submitted an application to the Board on the required 26 form and has paid a fee set by the Board.
- (c) For an individual applying for a license to practice funeral direction, the practical examination qualification under subsection **[(b)(5)] (B)(6)** of this section may not include demonstrating competency in embalming.
 - (D) THE BOARD SHALL ADVISE EACH APPLICANT THAT A LICENSE ISSUED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION DOES NOT GUARANTEE THAT THE APPLICANT WILL BE ALLOWED TO PRACTICE IN ANY OTHER STATE.
