CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Office of the Governor - State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the State Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council in the 4 Office of the Governor; providing for the membership of the Council; requiring 5 the Governor to designate the chair of the Council; providing for the terms of 6 the members of the Council; authorizing members of the Council to receive a 7 certain reimbursement; providing that a majority of the voting members of the 8 Council is a quorum; authorizing the Council to adopt certain procedures and 9 consult with State agencies; authorizing the chair to designate certain individuals to serve on a committee or task force of the Council; requiring the 10 11 Council to meet at least four times a year; providing for the purposes and duties of the Council; requiring the Office of the Governor to designate Alcohol and 1213 Drug Abuse Administration to provide staff for the Council; specifying the terms 14 of certain initial members of the Council; and generally relating to the State 15 Drug and Alcohol Abuse Council.
