- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a ballot issue committee that receives a contribution of a certain amount during a certain period before an election to report the 4 5 contribution to the State Board of Elections within a certain period of time; 6 requiring a report of a contribution under this Act to include certain 7 information; requiring the State Board to develop an Internet site for the 8 purpose of receiving reports of contributions under this Act and making the 9 reports available to the public; and generally relating to campaign finance 10 disclosure for a public referendum.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
  - Article Election Law

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- 1 (f) "Ballot issue committee" means a political committee that is formed to 2 promote the success or defeat of a question to be submitted to a vote at an election.
- 3 (i) "Campaign finance report" means a report, statement, affidavit, or other document that is:
- 5 (1) authorized or required under this article;
- 6 (2) related to the campaign finance activities of a campaign finance 7 entity or to expenses associated with a legislative newsletter; and
- 8 (3) filed or submitted on a form prescribed by the State Board under 9 this article.
- 10 (o) (1) "Contribution" means the gift or transfer, or promise of gift or transfer, of money or other thing of value to a campaign finance entity to promote or assist in the promotion of the success or defeat of a candidate, political party, or question.
- 14 (2) "Contribution" includes proceeds from the sale of tickets to a 15 campaign fund–raising event.
- 16 (gg) "Political committee" means a combination of two or more individuals 17 that assists or attempts to assist in promoting the success or defeat of a candidate, 18 political party, or question submitted to a vote at any election.
- 19 (rr) "State Board" means the State Board of Elections.

- 21 (A) A BALLOT ISSUE COMMITTEE THAT RECEIVES A CONTRIBUTION OF 22 \$5,000 OR MORE DURING THE PERIOD SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS 23 SECTION SHALL REPORT THE CONTRIBUTION TO THE STATE BOARD WITHIN 24 24 HOURS AFTER RECEIPT OF THE CONTRIBUTION.
- 25 (B) A BALLOT ISSUE COMMITTEE SHALL REPORT CONTRIBUTIONS
  26 RECEIVED DURING THE PERIOD FROM THE CLOSING DATE OF THE LAST
  27 CAMPAIGN FINANCE REPORT THAT IS DUE BEFORE A GENERAL ELECTION
  28 THROUGH THE DAY OF THE GENERAL ELECTION.
- 29 (C) A REPORT OF A CONTRIBUTION UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL 30 INCLUDE THE AMOUNT OF THE CONTRIBUTION AND THE IDENTITY OF THE 31 CONTRIBUTOR.
- 32 (D) THE STATE BOARD SHALL DEVELOP AN INTERNET SITE FOR THE 33 PURPOSE OF:
