4 (2) The Committee may examine the need for additional alterations to 5 the unemployment insurance system, including the charging and taxation provisions 6 and the eligibility and benefit provisions, in consideration of the fairness of the system 7 and in order to maintain the Unemployment Insurance Trust Fund at a level sufficient 8 to ensure that benefits will be paid from the Fund.
