- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain licensed physicians to prescribe or dispense 4 certain treatment for certain individuals with Lyme disease if certain 5 requirements are met; altering certain circumstances when the State Board of 6 Physicians may initiate certain disciplinary actions and professional misconduct 7 proceedings against certain licensed physicians; defining certain terms; 8 providing for the enforcement of this Act; providing for the application of this 9 Act; and generally relating to discipline for licensed physicians who provide treatment for Lyme disease. 10

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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20 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE 21 MEANINGS INDICATED.



- 1 (2) (I) "CLINICAL DIAGNOSIS" MEANS THE OBSERVATION OF 2 SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS COMPATIBLE WITH ACUTE INFECTION OR OTHER 3 CHRONIC MANIFESTATIONS OF LYME DISEASE BY A LICENSED PHYSICIAN.
- 4 (II) "CLINICAL DIAGNOSIS" INCLUDES THE OBSERVATION
 5 OF SURVEILLANCE CRITERIA SET FORTH BY THE UNITED STATES CENTERS FOR
 6 DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION.
- 7 (3) (I) "LONG-TERM ANTIBIOTIC OR ANTIMICROBIAL 8 THERAPY" MEANS THE ADMINISTRATION OF ORAL, INTRAMUSCULAR, OR 9 INTRAVENOUS ANTIBIOTICS OR ANTIMICROBIAL MEDICATIONS FOR A PERIOD 10 GREATER THAN 4 WEEKS.
- 11 (II) "LONG-TERM ANTIBIOTIC OR ANTIMICROBIAL 12 THERAPY" INCLUDES SEPARATE AND COMBINATION ADMINISTRATION OF 13 ANTIBIOTIC AND ANTIMICROBIAL MEDICATIONS.
- 14 (4) "LYME DISEASE" MEANS AN ACUTE INFECTION WITH 15 BORRELIA BURGDORFERI OR RELATED BORRELIOSES.
- 16 (5) "RELATED TICK-BORNE ILLNESS" MEANS BARTONELLOSIS, 17 BABESIOSIS, OR PIROPLASMOSIS, OR OTHER TICK-TRANSMITTABLE ILLNESS 18 THAT MAY BE ASSOCIATED WITH LYME DISEASE.
- 19 **(6)** "Therapeutic purpose" means the use of antibiotics 20 TO CONTROL THE SYMPTOMS OF LYME DISEASE AND OTHER RELATED 21 TICK-BORNE ILLNESSES AFTER CLINICAL DIAGNOSIS.
- 22 (B) THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE ENFORCED IF THE CENTERS FOR 23 DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION HAS ISSUED AN OPINION 24 RECOMMENDING THAT LONG-TERM ANTIBIOTIC OR ANTIMICROBIAL THERAPY 25 NOT BE USED IN THE TREATMENT OF LYME DISEASE.
- (C) IF AN INDIVIDUAL'S CLINICAL DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT PLAN
 ARE DOCUMENTED IN THE INDIVIDUAL'S MEDICAL RECORD, A LICENSED
 PHYSICIAN MAY PRESCRIBE OR DISPENSE LONG-TERM ANTIBIOTIC OR
 ANTIMICROBIAL THERAPY FOR THERAPEUTIC PURPOSES TO THE INDIVIDUAL.
- 30 (D) IF A LICENSED PHYSICIAN PRESCRIBES OR DISPENSES LONG—TERM
 31 ANTIBIOTIC OR ANTIMICROBIAL THERAPY UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS
 32 SECTION, THE LICENSED PHYSICIAN MAY NOT BE SUBJECT TO A PROFESSIONAL
 33 MISCONDUCT PROCEEDING OR A DISCIPLINARY ACTION BY THE BOARD.

4	(1) FOR PRESCRIBING OR DISPENSING LONG-TERM ANTIBIOTIC	
5	OR ANTIMICROBIAL THERAPY FOR A NONTHERAPEUTIC PURPOSE;	
6	(2) FOR FAILING TO MONITOR THE ONGOING CARE OF AN	
7	INDIVIDUAL RECEIVING LONG-TERM ANTIBIOTIC OR ANTIMICROBIAL THERAPY;	
8	(3) FOR FAILING TO KEEP COMPLETE AND ACCURATE RECORDS	
9	OF THE CLINICAL DIAGNOSIS AND TREATMENT OF AN INDIVIDUAL RECEIVING	
10	LONG-TERM ANTIBIOTIC OR ANTIMICROBIAL THERAPY; OR	
11	(4) FOR PRESCRIBING THE INCORRECT ANTIBIOTIC TO TREAT	
12	THE DIAGNOSED CONDITION OF THE PATIENT.

14	applicable disciplinary actions and professional misconduct proceedings pending on or	
15	before the effective date of this Act and all proceedings initiated thereafter.
