1 AN ACT concerning 2 State Government - State Soil - Sassafras Soil 3 FOR the purpose of designating Sassafras sandy loam as the State soil. BY adding to 4 5 Article – State Government 6 Section 13–322 7 Annotated Code of Maryland 8 (2009 Replacement Volume) 9 Preamble 10 WHEREAS, Nearly half of the states of the United States have shown their 11 significant concern for soil by designating an official state soil; and 12 WHEREAS, The State of Maryland has a significant concern for its soil 13 resources; and 14 WHEREAS, Soils enhance the quality of surface and ground waters and serve as the foundation for our beautiful agriculture, our unique wildlife habitats, our 15 beautiful landscapes, and the homes and communities of our citizens, and are a 16 17 significant component of the Chesapeake Bay estuarine ecosystem; and 18 WHEREAS, Soils are essential to the quality of life and welfare of all 19 Marylanders; and 20 WHEREAS, Sassafras sandy loam (fine-loamy, siliceous, semiactive, mesic 21Typic Hapludults) covers more land area than any other soil in Maryland, is used for a 22 wide variety of purposes, and is unique in the history of the State of Maryland and the 23 United States; and

- 3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 4 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 5 Article State Government
- 6 **13–322.**
- SASSAFRAS SANDY LOAM (FINE-LOAMY, SILICEOUS, SEMIACTIVE, MESIC TYPIC HAPLUDULTS) IS THE STATE SOIL.
- 9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2010.
