5	under certain circumstances; requiring that certain documents be completed by
6	a certain date; requiring that a certain reduction be made to the retirement
7	allowances of certain employees of Upper Shore Community Mental Health
8 9	Center; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to employees of Upper Shore Community Mental Health Center receiving an early
10	retirement allowance.

16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
18	Article - State Personnel and Pensions
19	23–402.
20	(a) A member may retire with an early service retirement allowance if:
21 22	(1) the member completes and submits a written application to the Board of Trustees stating the date when the member desires to retire; and
23	(2) on or before the date of retirement, the member:

1 2	(i) has at least 15 years but less than 30 years of eligibility service; and
3	(ii) is at least 55 but less than 62 years old.
$\frac{4}{5}$ $\frac{6}{7}$	(b) On retirement under this section, a member is entitled to receive an early service retirement allowance that equals the normal service retirement allowance under § 23–401 of this subtitle, reduced by 0.5% for each month that the member's early retirement date precedes the date the member will be 62 years old.
8	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
9	(a) This section applies only to an employee of Upper Shore Community Mental Health Center who:
$\frac{1}{2}$	(1) was employed by Upper Shore Community Mental Health Center on July 1, 2009, but whose job is abolished on or after August 1, 2009;
13 14 15	(2) on or before the date that the employee's job with Upper Shore Community Mental Health Center is abolished, is at least 54 years old and has at least 25 years of service in the State Retirement and Pension System; and
16 17	(3) on the date that the employee's job with Upper Shore Community Mental Health Center is abolished, is a member of the Employees' Pension System.
18 19 20 21	(b) An employee described under subsection (a) of this section may retire with an early service retirement allowance if the member completes and submits a written application on or before December 31, 2010, to the Board of Trustees stating the date when the member desires to retire.
22 23 24 25 26	(c) An employee described under subsection (a) of this section is entitled to receive an early service retirement allowance that equals the normal service retirement allowance under § 23–401 of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, reduced by 0.5% for each month that the employee's early retirement date precedes the date the employee will be 62 years old.
27 28 29 30	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2010. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 months and, at the end of December 31, 2010, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
