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Procurement - Service-Disabled Veteran Business Enterprise Participation

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a certain participation goal for certain certified 4 service-disabled veteran business enterprises for certain procurement 5 contracts; requiring certain solicitation documents to establish the degree of 6 participation based on certain information; providing that certain provisions of 7 this Act do not apply in certain circumstances; requiring a unit to award certain procurement contracts to certain bidders or offerors under certain 8 9 circumstances; requiring the Board of Public Works to adopt certain regulations 10 to implement this Act; requiring the Board to establish certain tracking and 11 reporting procedures; requiring the Board to report annually on a certain 12 program to the Legislative Policy Committee; establishing certain prohibited 13 acts and certain penalties for certain violations; providing that certain provisions of law relating to protests do not apply to certain acts or omissions by 14 15 certain procurement agencies under certain circumstances; requiring the Department of Business and Economic Development to use certain resources to 16 17 implement a certain program; and generally relating to procurement 18 participation by service-disabled veteran business enterprises.
