1 AN ACT concerning

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Procurement - Service-Disabled Veteran <u>Veteran-Owned Small</u> Business Enterprise Participation

FOR the purpose of establishing a certain participation goal for certain certified service-disabled veteran-owned small business enterprises for certain procurement contracts; requiring certain solicitation documents to establish the degree of participation based on certain information; providing that certain provisions of this Act do not apply in certain circumstances; requiring a unit to award certain procurement contracts to certain bidders or offerors under certain circumstances; requiring the Board of Public Works to adopt certain regulations to implement this Act; requiring the Board to establish certain tracking and reporting procedures; requiring the Board to report annually on a certain program to the Legislative Policy Committee; establishing certain prohibited acts and certain penalties for certain violations; providing that certain provisions of law relating to protests do not apply to certain acts or omissions by certain procurement agencies under certain circumstances; requiring the Department of Business and Economic Development to use certain resources to implement a certain program; and generally relating to procurement participation by service-disabled veteran veteran-owned small business enterprises.
