## A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

### State Commission of Real Estate Appraisers and Home Inspectors – Administrative Sanctions – Civil Penalty

#### 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Commission of Real Estate Appraisers and $\mathbf{5}$ Home Inspectors to consider certain factors before granting, denying, renewing, 6 suspending, or revoking a home inspector license or reprimanding a licensee when 7 the applicant or licensee has been convicted of a certain crime; authorizing the 8 Commission to impose a civil penalty instead of, or in addition to, the imposition of 9 an administrative sanction against a licensed home inspector under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the State Commission of Real Estate 10 Appraisers and Home Inspectors. 11

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

(A) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 16–602 of this title, the Commission
may deny a home inspector license to any applicant, reprimand any home inspector
licensee, or suspend or revoke a home inspector license if the applicant or licensee:

1 (C) THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING FACTS IN THE 2 GRANTING, DENIAL, RENEWAL, SUSPENSION, OR REVOCATION OF A LICENSE OR 3 THE REPRIMAND OF A LICENSEE WHEN AN APPLICANT OR LICENSEE IS 4 CONVICTED OF A FELONY OR A MISDEMEANOR DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION 5 (A)(4) OF THIS SECTION:

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(1) THE NATURE OF THE CRIME;

7 (2) THE RELATIONSHIP OF THE CRIME TO THE ACTIVITIES 8 AUTHORIZED BY THE LICENSE;

9 (3) WITH RESPECT TO A FELONY, THE RELEVANCE OF THE 10 CONVICTION TO THE FITNESS AND QUALIFICATION OF THE APPLICANT OR 11 LICENSEE TO PROVIDE HOME INSPECTION SERVICES;

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(4) THE LENGTH OF TIME SINCE THE CONVICTION; AND

13(5) THE BEHAVIOR AND ACTIVITIES OF THE APPLICANT OR14LICENSEE BEFORE AND AFTER THE CONVICTION.

15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect16 October 1, 2010.
